the N.E. steering E. middle part calm
at 2 P.M. commences boiling latter part
light breeze with fog at 7 P.M. made
sail leaving by the wing S.E.

These 24 hours
commences with a light breeze from
the S. heading N.E. and a boiling
the whole middle and latter part moderate
weather a boiling

Sunday June the 25th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a light breeze from
the Eastward steering Southward nothing but
finbacks in sight a boiling at 3 P.M.
lacked ship to N.E. middle strong
breeze at 3 P.M. finished boiling latter part
at 11 P.M. saw right whales and lowered
3 boats and chased but done nothing

Monday June the 26th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a strong breeze from
the Eastward whales in sight at 2 P.M.
lowered 3 boats but done nothing at 4
returned on board and at 6 took in sail
middle part strong breeze from the Eastward
at 3 P.M. was ship to N.E. latter part
much the same at 4 comd. showing down

Capt Coffin on the North-West Coast

latter part much the same with to the E.

Tuesday June the 27th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a strong breeze from
heading S.E. by the wind showing course
at 4 P.M. saw whales lowered one boat
did not get feet at 5 one ship in sight
middle and latter part strong breeze
from the Eastward heading S.E. with one
ship in sight saw right whales lowered
1 boat did done nothing breaking out
the hole for sharks

Wednesday June the 28th 1848

These 24 hours
commences with a strong breeze from
the Westward saw whales and lowered
but did not get on at sunset took in
sail with rain and fog one ship in
sight middle part moderate breeze from
the Westward heading S. latter part
light breeze from the Westward steering
S.E. with one ship in sight

These 24 hours
commences with a light breeze from
the Westward heading S. at 6 P.M. were ship
to N. middle part at 1 springing up a
gale from the Westward heading S.E.
at 2 took in sail at 7 P.M. more
