

The Ship Charles Davis of New Bedford

now soon heading S.W. wind to the
West. Lat Long.

Wednesday July the 18th 1848

Remained 24 hours
commenced with a moderate breeze from
the West. Latter part at 5 took ship to S.W.
at 11 finished stowing down oil plenty of fog
latter part light breeze at 12 commenced breaking
out the after hatch with a little of fog.
Lat Long.

Thursday July the 19th 1848

Remained with a calm
and fog at 2 saw a right whale and lowered
3 boats and got him at 4 took him along
side middle part at 5 commenced cutting at
latter part slight breeze from the Eastward
steering to the West at 8 finished cutting
at 11 saw a whale. Lat Long.

Friday July the 20th 1848

Remained with a
light breeze from the East steering to the
West at 12 lowered 3 boats and chased but
did not get on middle and latter part fine breeze
from the North and West steering N.W. Lat Long.

Saturday July the 21st 1848

Remained with a
light breeze from the W.N.W. steering S.W.
middle part calm at 3 commenced boiling
the whale latter part the same course S.W.
Lat Long.

Saturday July the 22nd 1848

Remained with a
with a calm course S.W. a boiling middle
and latter part moderate breeze from the N.E.
steering S. Lat Long.

Sunday July the 23rd 1848

Remained with a
moderate breeze from the S.E. steering
S. still a boiling middle part fresh
breeze at 3 saw a sail and at 4 spoke the
ship towards of New Bedford with 2200
lbs 39^{me} out still a boiling latter part
moderate breeze from the East steering
to the North with 2 ships in sight at 8
finished boiling the whale and spoke the
ship George Washington of Wareham with
700 lbs 5^{me} out steering North.
Lat Long.

Monday July the 24th 1848

Remained with a fine
breeze from the East steering S. in
company with two ships at 2 saw one other
cutting a whale it was the Eugene of
Hennington with a whale at 4 spoke in
sail with fog middle and latter at 4 made
sail at 6 the ship Edwards killed a whale
and sunk him not land in sight.
Lat Long.

Tuesday July the 25th 1848

Remained with a
strong breeze from the North and
East with plenty of whales in sight
two ships in sight a whaling it at 6
we lowered 3 boats but could not get on.
