and chased but did not strike with one ship in sight inside was a light breeze from the West steering E.S.E. at 2 finished boiling latter part fine weather Sat. Long

Wednesday Aug the 2<sup>d</sup> 1848

Come with a fine breeze from the West steering E.S.E. with plenty of whales in sight at 5 AM lowered 4 boats and got one whale at middle part at 8 took him alongside and at 3 AM cutting latter part a strong breeze from the East heading S.E. with rainy weather and plenty of whales in sight at 10 AM finished cutting at 11 AM Come stowing down Oil Sat. Long

Thursday Aug the 3<sup>d</sup> 1848

Come with a strong breeze from the East heading S.E. with rain, stowing down Oil at 5 AM finished stowing down and then wore ship to the South at 10 AM wore ship to the N.E. at 4 saw plenty of whales latter part the wind hauled round to the South steering E.S.E. closed to the wind with land in sight at 10 lowered 3 boats and chased but no success

Friday Aug the 4<sup>th</sup> 1848

Come with a strong breeze from the South chasing whales at 7 returned on board with out success with some quantity of whales in sight at 8 AM cutting at 4 saw a ship and whale lowered 1 boat but no success

latter part calm at 9 lowered 1 boat but no success with land in sight

Saturday Aug the 5<sup>th</sup> 1848

Come with a light breeze from the N.W. with land in sight and one sail at 1 AM lowered 1 boat at 4 lowered 2 others boats but no success with plenty of whales in sight middle part at 4 saw whales at 5 lowered 1 boat but no success latter part light breeze from the South at 11 AM lowered one boat and got fast and hauled out at 12 got fast again and saved the whale

Sunday Aug the 6<sup>th</sup> 1848

Come with a fine breeze from the South and West cutting and boiling with rainy weather middle part strong breeze at 5 lowered one boat and got fast and the iron drew again latter part plenty of whales at 6 AM lowered 3 boats and got one whale at 8 AM took him alongside with one ship in sight at cutting

Monday Aug the 7<sup>th</sup> 1848

Come with a strong breeze from the South and West cutting and boiling at 8 AM the vessel was a boiling to latter part at 11 AM stowing down Oil with 2 ships in sight
