Remarks Monday Sept 14th 1846

Comd. with strong from N. W. to N. with squalls
of rain ship under double reefed top. course E
Wind more moderate & rainy
Latter light winds N & light showers of rain
Lat 30 37 Long.

Remarks Tuesday Sept 15th

Comd. with a light breeze from N. to N. W. all
sail set course S. E. by E.
Mild light variable wind & cloudy
Latter wind to the S. W. & rainy (Capt. taken ill
& sail in sight) Lat by act 30 10 Long 38 38

Remarks Wednesday Sept 16

First part blowing on & rainy took in the
light sails reefed top & at 3 P.M. called all hands
took in fore & miz. top. jib & mainsail & hove
two to the N.

Mild. wind calmed to the N. & moderated at 10 kpts
off S. E. by E. Latter part light winds N. to S. W.
Cloudy. Spliced the M. Spencer gaff &c. Capt.
getting better Lat by act 30 10 Long 38 38

Remarks Thursday Sept 17

Fine breeze S. S. W. & hazy all sail out course
S. E. by E. the sail to windward
Mild wind N. & blowing on double reefed top & 4

hands set & on sail Latter part strong gales
S. & hazy Lat by act 40 33 Long 33 30

Remarks Friday Sept 18th

Comd. strong gales N. under double reefed top
course S. E. by E. (Capt. convalescent) Mild wind
shifted to N. still under double reefed top Latter
part the same broke out for water at 11 A.M.
made the N. of Flores bearing E. N. E. 25 W. dist.
Lat 39 02 Long 30 46

Remarks on board Saturday Sept 19

Strong gales N. still under double reefed top at 1
P.M. left off S. E. for Sagal saw a bark to wind.
at sunset took in light & on sail more moderate Latter
wind N. & all sail set at 5 A.M. made Sagal bearing E. N. E. 25 W.
saw a bark but no sail in sight

Remarks on board Sunday Sept 20th 1846

First part fine breeze N. E. at 1 P.M. the Capt. &
boat crew went on shore & had notice up aboard
the town the came on board. Mild light and calm
Ship in the passage abreast the town Latter part
light and at sunrise the Capt. went on shore for
recruits at 10 A.M. the lighter came alongside with
140 bush. potatoes 12000 Onions 150 Cabbage 150 lbs
milk 10 fowls a few pounds beef & a keg of wine

Remarks on board Monday Sept 21st

Comd. with a fine breeze at 1 P.M. the Capt.
came on board with 3 Portuguese men which he has
shipped & kept her off to the N. E. on our intended

Voyage at sunset between the N. E. of Port
St George Mill & Latter strong gales N. & W.
under double reefed top course S. E. by E. passed a
Bark & Brig Lat 37 4

Remarks Tuesday Sept 22nd

First more moderate & some rain from the
N. under single reefed top opened a catch boat
will mind N. & pleasant Latter do lower
the boats for a shoal of Blackfish but did not get
fast saw a Brig bound to the N. E.

Remarks Wednesday Sept 23

First part light breeze N. W. & fine weather all sail
set course S. E. by E. started water from fine weather
Latter light and S. & E. all hands employed setting up
stanking rigging saw one sail Lat 34 01 Long 26 31

Remarks Thursday Sept 24th

First part S. E. lowered the boats for Blackfish
but did not get up with them but caught a prop
saw much the same Latter light wind S. W.
& pleasant all hands setting up rigging Lat 33 22

Remarks Friday Sept 25th

First part light and S. W. by the wind S. E. saw
Blackfish going fresh to the N. W. Latter much the
same lowered the boats for Blackfish and not get fast
saw out the fly jib &c. Lat 32 20 Long 35 14
