

Ship Charles Green N.W. Coast

Tuesday May 18th 1847

The gales continued about the same with squalls of fog but more moderate set double reefed tops at daylight at 10 P.M. started the works again latter wind to the W & foggy

Wednesday May 19th

Fresh gales W.S.W. & thick weather boiling under double reefed tops on the northern tack opened bbl Reef & Port Mica & Latter light mizzen S.E. & foggy boiling open the Ship Reep of St. London No Obs.

Thursday May 20th

Moderate breeze S.E. & thick weather boiling with the sail heads to the E Mica & Latter light mizzen & foggy broke out the main hatch to stow oil opened bbl flour Lat 53 Long 62.2

Friday May 21st

Light mizzen S.E. little rain & foggy stowed 100 bbl of Mica & Latter rainy Lat 53 35

Saturday May 22nd

Wind shifted to S.W. & cleared off main sail & stowed S.E. sun many fimbles employed starting & stowing water between decks at sunset took in sail Mica & Latter about the same finished stowing oil started cash Board Lat 53 3 Long 161 23

Sunday May 23rd

Light mizzen S.W. & fine weather washed ship & stowed through the night set to under short sail Latter moderate & heavy one sail in sight at 11 am 2 whales Lat 53

Monday May 24th

Moderate breeze from the E & foggy lowered for the 2 whales did not get fast many fimbles in sight Mica & Latter light mizzen at N & Sibly weather saw humpback fimbles Lat 53 8 Long 162 32

Tuesday May 25th

Fresh breeze N & cloudy uncomfortable weather steering S.W. chased whales but could not get near them Mica & Latter at 2 ships & many fimbles in sight Lat 53 56

Wednesday May 26th

Came in with fresh gales N & pleasant but cold day - ing all sail to the E in search of whales Mica about the same Latter as at 7 A.M. put off for whales did not get fast Lat 53 54 Long 160 45

Thursday May 27th

Fresh gales N & cloudy saw several whales but did not get fast Mica & Latter wind the same & fine weather fimbles humpback 10 in sight but no sight whales 2 sail in sight Lat 53 4

Friday May 28th 1847

Light breeze N.W. & pleasant steering to the N.E. saw humpback at 8 P.M. spoke ship Alk Barclay 1 whale in season Mica & Latter light wind & fine weather bound to E both out water Lat 53 5

Saturday May 29th

Light mizzen from N to N.E. & fine weather but no fish. work ing to the N.E. Mica & Latter as 1 sail in sight Lat 53 21

Sunday May 30th

Light wind & calm saw & chased a whale going quick to the S.E. Mica about the same Latter light wind at N & heavy part off the boats for whales stowed from one & took the other alongside No Obs

Monday May 31st

Light wind & calm some fog cut the whale several stuns in sight sent off the B boat did not get fast Mica calm & foggy Latter about the same com. boiling one sail in sight No Obs

Tuesday June 1st

Light wind & calm boiling, two ships in sight Mica & Latter about the same Lat 53 27

Wednesday June 2nd

Light wind & calm boiling spoke the ship (Carrilla) of N.E. 2 whales saw her boats after a whale but did not get fast at 9 P.M. wind at N.E. more ship to the N.W. opened bbl Reef & Port Mica light breeze S.E. Latter N. finished boiling chased whales Lat 53 37 158

Thursday June 3rd

Just past light from N to N.W. steering to S.E. chased a whale going so quick could not get up with her saw a ship cutting Mica about the same stowed N.E. under short sail Latter fresh gales W.S.W. & rugg with some rain kept her off to the E & com. stowing oil saw 2 ships No Obs

Friday June 4th

Cloud with stormy gales W.S.W. at 4 P.M. finished stowing oil & tuffed too under close reefed Mica top & opened to S.W. some rainy weather ship Mica rugg Latter wind S.W. steering to the N.E. copper employed setting up masts for water Lat 53 39 Long 156 0
