

Ship Charles Green N.W. Coast

Tuesday June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1847

First part fresh breeze but to fine weather put off for whaling struck one & the line parted spoke ship Montecore of A.B. Mica & latter fresh gales to chased whales going quick in different directions several in sight

Wednesday June 23<sup>rd</sup>

Fresh gales to heavy rain many whales most of them going quick struck one & the iron down spoke ship Braganza boiling Mica & latter do plenty whales in sight could not get fast several ships in sight 58 31

Thursday June 24<sup>th</sup>

Fresh gales to & good weather struck two whales the iron down from one the other took the line fastness to him with the second boat took out one line & part of another & drew from him went on board & took in sail

Mica do latter light breeze & calm lowered & took a whale along side & commenced cutting the tail in sight 58 24 14030

Friday June 25<sup>th</sup>

Light breeze to calm struck cutting put off 2 boats for whales turned one up & come towing at 8 P.M. took him along side spoke ship Elphrates 10 whales Mica & latter blowing fresh from the E & an ugly sea too rugged to cut the whale but kept the work going no ill

Saturday June 26<sup>th</sup>

Calm about the same with some rain at 5 P.M. the wind came to the S & increased with Mica & a shower rain latter calm & a heavy swell commenced cutting so rugged that the whale took off some of the sheathing & copper from the ship strap parted & lost the head Lat 59 & cutting & boiling

Sunday June 27<sup>th</sup>

Calm with a heavy swell finished cutting put off one boat for a whale did not get fast laid in sight bearing from N.E. to N.W. about 20 miles distant at sunset made all sail & headed off shore to the S. with a light air from the N.E. Mica do latter fresh gales took in the Mica top employed boiling two ships & a Breckin in sight opened all flour

plenty whales in sight

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Monday June 28<sup>th</sup> 1847

First part fresh gales N.E. & going boiling & storing oil in the main hold Mica do latter about the same ship Elphrates close to

Tuesday June 29<sup>th</sup>

Strong gales E & E & a heavy sea rain & boiling under the lee of the fore sail at sunset 120 bbl oil on deck Mica do latter wind came to the S. more ships to the E. too sail in sight

Wednesday June 30<sup>th</sup>

Fresh gales & some rain from S.E. ship heading to the E boiling opened a bbl Mica Mica & latter about the same boiling & storing oil spoke ship St. Lawrence of Saginaw & whales

Thursday July 1<sup>st</sup>

First part strong gales E & rugged & rainy boiling & storing oil at 4 sailing cools down opened bbl Mica & latter Mica do latter wind S.W. & some rain boiling & storing oil at 4 fathoms

Mica breeze to & rain at 4 finished boiling & storing spoke ship Lancaster of N.B. St. Lawrence of Sag. & Steigle of Bridgeport Mica do latter light winds & a little rain at 12 took a whale along side

Friday July 2<sup>nd</sup>

Light breeze to a heavy swell in looking on to the whale lost the fin chain but got him in in time Mica some rain latter Easty wind & some rain chased whales coming & made a fine stop of 12 feet 2 1/2 in. rope

Saturday July 3<sup>rd</sup>

First part fresh gales E & E & squalls of rain cooled down chased whales Mica wind came to the N. & clear weather latter fresh gales from N. & rugged sea & chased plenty whales all going quick split the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> 5 ship in sight most of them chasing whales but got none

Sunday July 4<sup>th</sup>

Mica breeze to Monday July 5<sup>th</sup> First part fresh gales N. & rugged sea & spoke ship Lancaster of N.B. & whales Mica missed one Mica Mica latter light swell in sea & some fog took a whale & some cutting at 4 fathoms struck another & came from him
