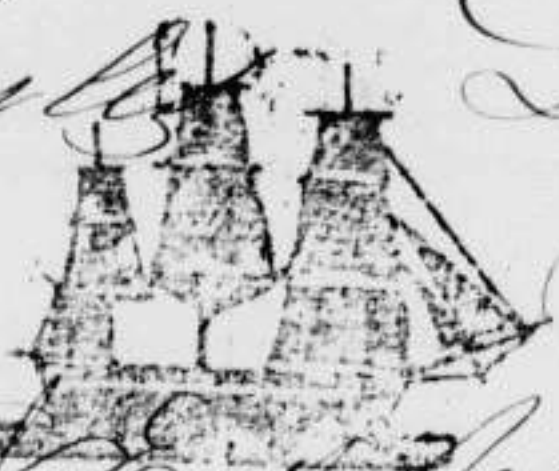


Ship Charles Drown on the N.W. coast



Wednesday May 11 1848

Fresh gales V. & E. & foggy under double reefed tops to the N.W. saw one small whale several finches also many ducks flying past. Mid much the same. Lattie lightened from the E. & squalls of fog. spoke ship Enphrates of A.P. one small whale the season chased a whale did not get fast.



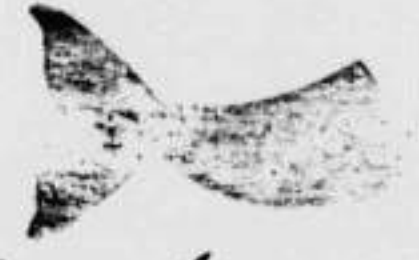
Thursday May 12th

Light airs from the E. & calm jaming with the E. chased several whales but all to no purpose. mid light airs. Lattie fresh breeze of N.E. & some rain saw many finches at 10 A.M. took in top gale sails. No Oil.



Friday May 13th

Came in with fresh gales from the E. & rain took in sail & headed to the W. at sunset more ship to the E. mid much the same. Lattie wind shifted to the S.E. blew fresh & raining put off for whale did not get fast took the boat & took in sail.



Saturday May 13th

Came in with fresh gales from the S.E. & rain being too to the E. mid & Lattie the same. No Oil.

Sunday May 14th

Came in the same still being too mid N.E. & blowing on at 3 P.M. close reefed the top. Lattie wind S.E. with a rough sea. Lat 57 18 Long 143 12.

Monday May 15th

First part fresh gales S.E. & cloudy riding to under short sail mid much the same. Lattie do with some fog or fine rain about the E. top to repair. open the floor.

Tuesday May 16th

First part more moderate wind came to the W. bent the E. tops & set them close reefed heading to the S.E. opened the Bul & spoke each board. saw several finches. mid much the same. Lattie wind shifted to the S.E. & moderated. Lat 56 13.

Wednesday May 17th

Westerly wind & fine weather steering to the E. saw many finches. mid & Lattie repaired the top gale sail. Lat 56 14 140.



Thursday May 18th

Wind W. & N.W. & fine weather spoke ship Meas of A.P. many fin & humbirds in sight saw the ship. spoke fast to a whale did not get him. mid & Lattie weather the same chased several whales did not get fast & sail in sight.

Friday May 19th 1848

Light winds N.W. & fine weather saw many finches mid & Lattie about the same standing to the S.W. saw many finches broke out for water. Lat 55 23.

Saturday May 20th

Came in with light winds from N.W. & fine weather standing to the S.W. saw finches. mid light air & foggy Lattie much the same one sail in sight. Lat 55 2 142 28.

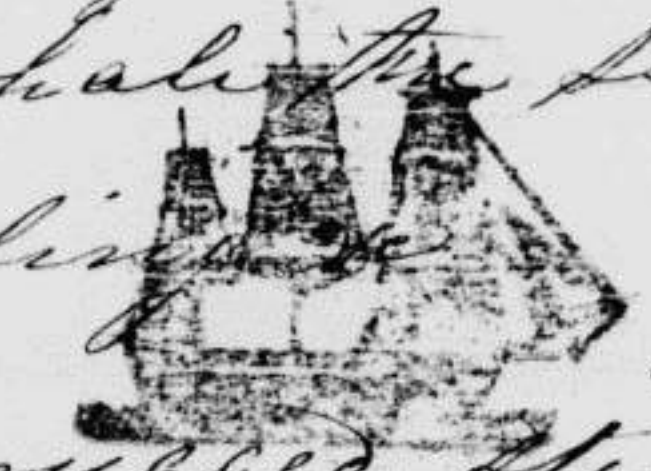
Sunday May 21st

Light variable air & calm steering N.W. saw many finches mid much the same. Lattie fresh breeze from E.S.E. & calm. put off for a whale at 10 took him alongside & come. Lattie. Lat 56 4 143 20.



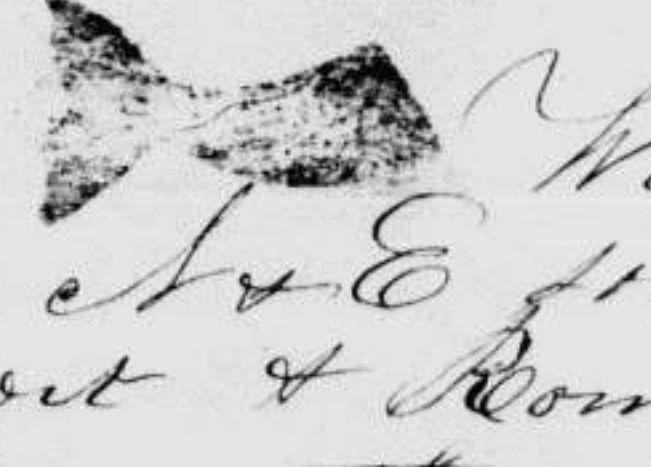
Monday May 22nd

First part gales & ruggs finished cutting spoke ship Emily (Morgan) one whale the season mid much the same. Lattie as employed boiling. Lat 56 34 Long 143 23.



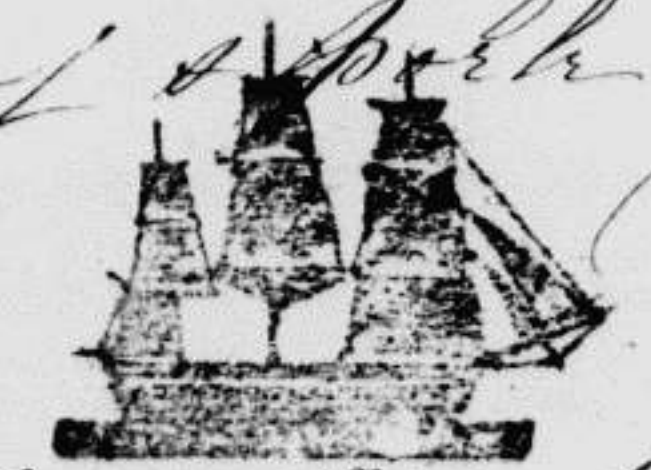
Tuesday May 23rd

Fresh gales S.E. & ruggs steering off to the W. boiling mid & Lattie much the same chased two whales did not get fast employed boiling. No Oil.



Wednesday May 24th

Fresh gales & ruggs N.E. some said spotted ship. humbird of Bridgeport & Roman of N.P. no oil the season mid & Lattie thick dark weather for boiling did not make any part opened the Bul & spoke. No Oil.



Thursday May 25th

Heavy calm & thick fog under short sail boiling one sail in sight mid do. Lattie fresh breeze S.E. & fine weather come flowing oil in the after hold at 10 spoke ship Roman of A.P. at 11 put off for a whale four ships in sight.



Friday May 26th

Came in the same at 2 P.M. took the whale alongside at 3 come cutting at 4 finished Lattie light wind from the E. & cloudy employed flowing oil chasing ships & several ships in sight. No Oil.

Saturday May 27th

Light steadily weather finished flowing & small employed at 6 P.M. the first whale for oil mid boiling Lattie as some foggy saw finches opened each board. Lat 57 20 146.
