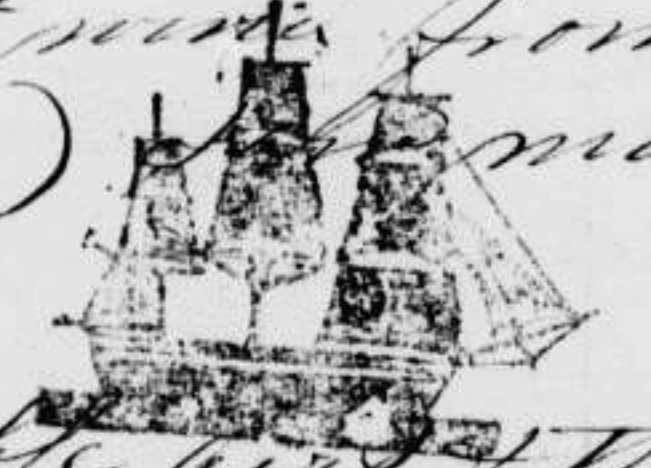


Ship Charles Dren on the N. H.

Sunday July 3rd 1848

First part wind from N. & E. & S. E. at 5 P.M. double reefed
(some rain) many hump & finches mid do latter light
and foggy No Ob

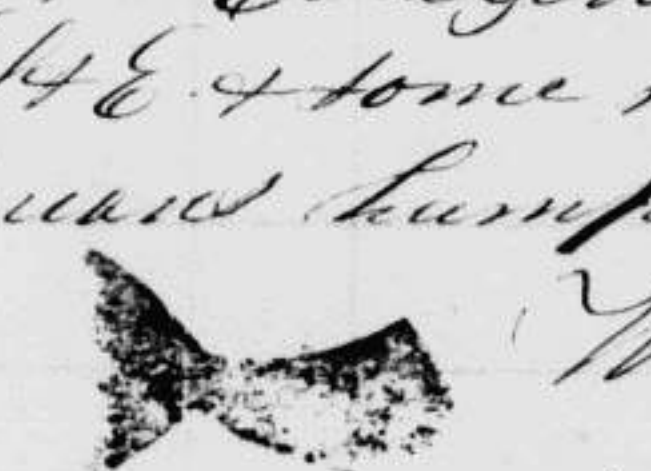
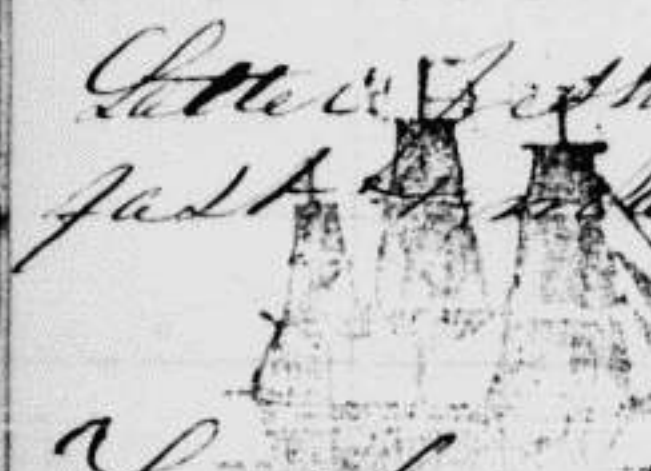


Light variable wind & thick atmosphere spoke ship captain
of N Bedford Capt came on board & took tea mid & latter
light variable wind & some fog steering E by S & opened
the fore & opened all bark & fore No Ob



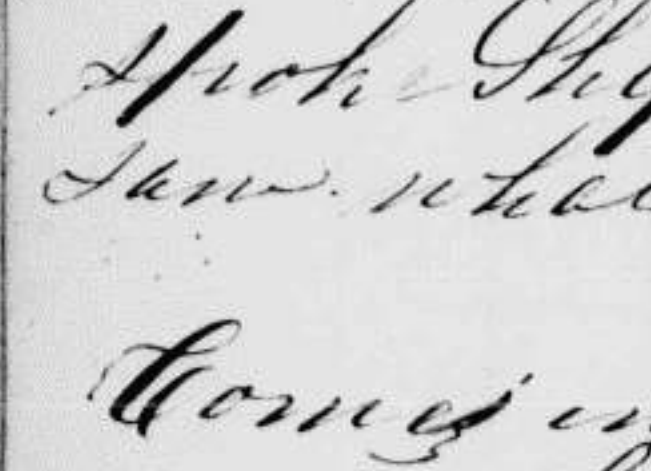
Tuesday July 4th

Came in with light wind from the N. & Chazy spoke ship
Adeline of N. H. & Citizen of Sagitt. mid much the same
light fresh gales S. E. & some rain saw one right whale in sight
just before Chazy & Edward hump finches to the two ships in sight



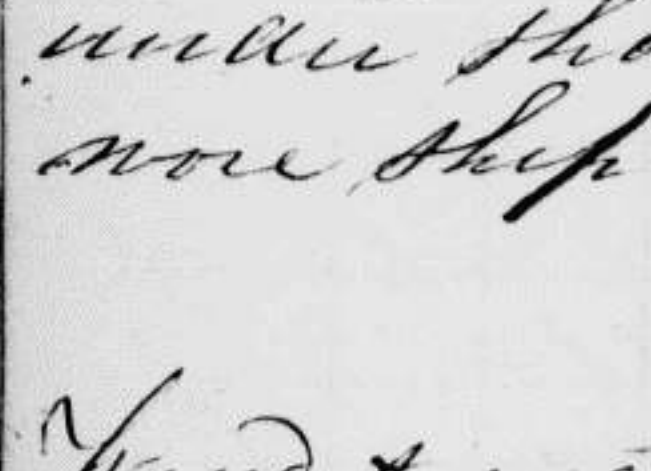
Wednesday July 5th

Light gales S. E. & some rain weather steering to the N.
at 5 P.M. have took the N. under stars sail at 6 wind veered
to S. & moderates mid & latter blowing on again & raining
spoke ship Emily Morgan & whales the season Lat 56 54
saw whales but too foggy to lower



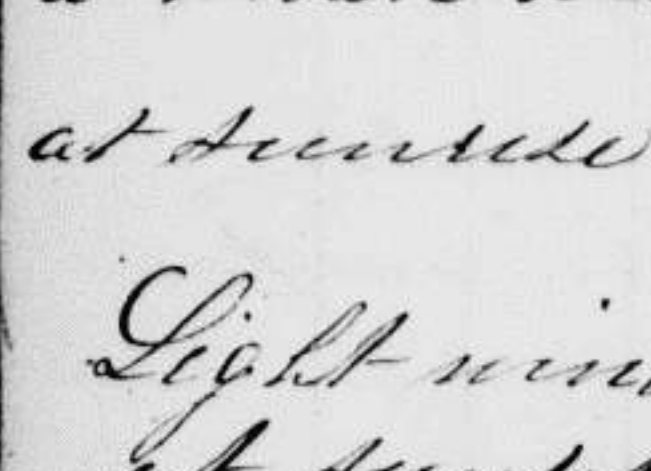
Thursday July 6th

Came in with fresh gales S. E. & squalls rugged weather
under short sail to the N. at 2 P.M. saw the land off Citea
more ship & the N. H. mid & latter much the same Lat 56 44



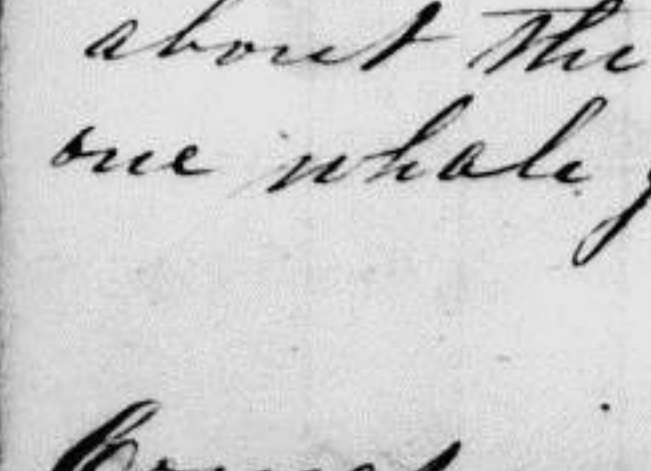
Friday July 7th

Wind & weather much the same spoke ship Sabus & Emily
Morgan chased a whale & saw several others but too rugged to lower
mid light and latter light breeze W. N. W. & fine weather chased
a whale did not get lost saw the other 2 ships in sight chase
at sundown land in sight Lat 57 7



Saturday July 8th

Light wind from W. N. W. & fine weather saw many finches
at sunset shortened sail & steered E. S. E. mid do latter wind
about the same & cloudy hazy weather saw many finches &
one whale going so quick as not lower 2 ships in sight



Sunday July 9th

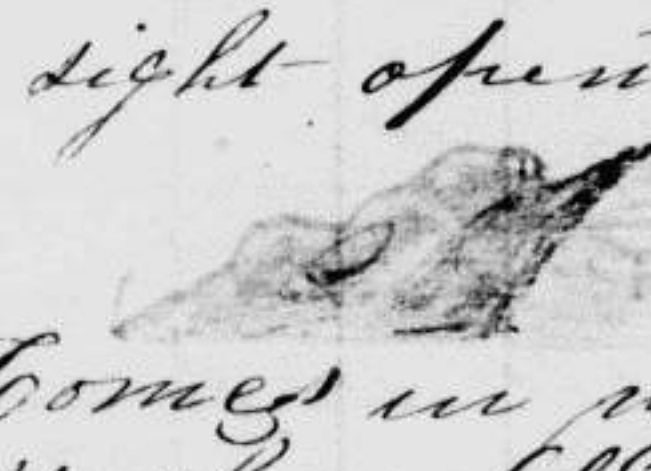
Came in about the same hauled by the wind to the N. mid
& latter fine weather chased a whale could not get up to him
saw in sight Lat 57 21



Ship Charles Dren off King George Id

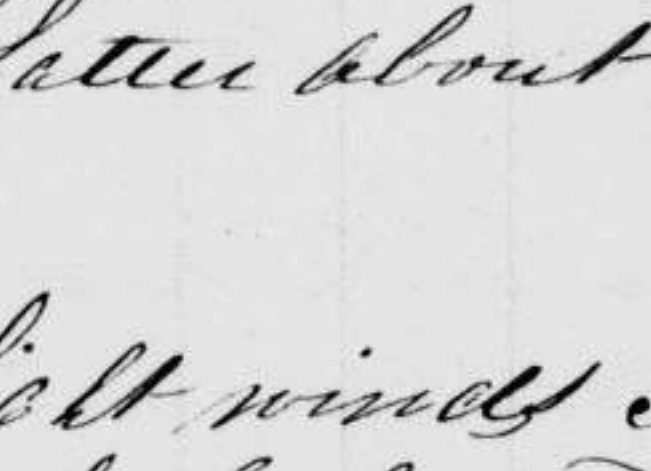
Monday July 10th 1848

Light wind from N. W. & squalls of fog chased 2 whales
but could not get fast. whales small & very wild at 4 P.M.
tacked N. W. land in sight mid & latter about the same land
in sight opened all bark & fore Lat 57 47



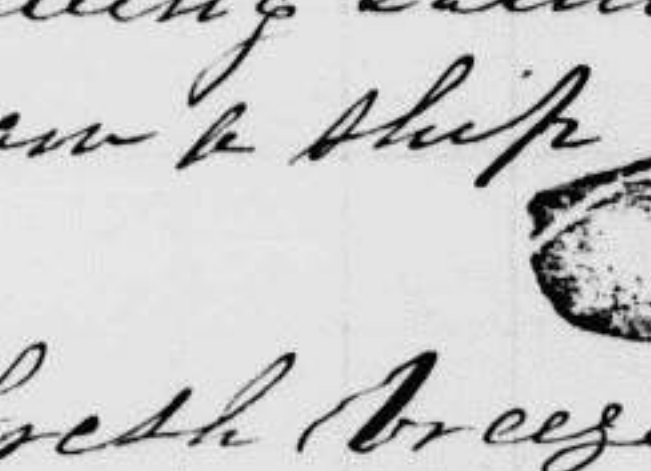
Tuesday July 11th

Came in with light air from the N. at 4 P.M. tacked
off shore N. W. & chased a whale did not get fast mid &
latter about the same (cloudy) No Ob by at 57 20



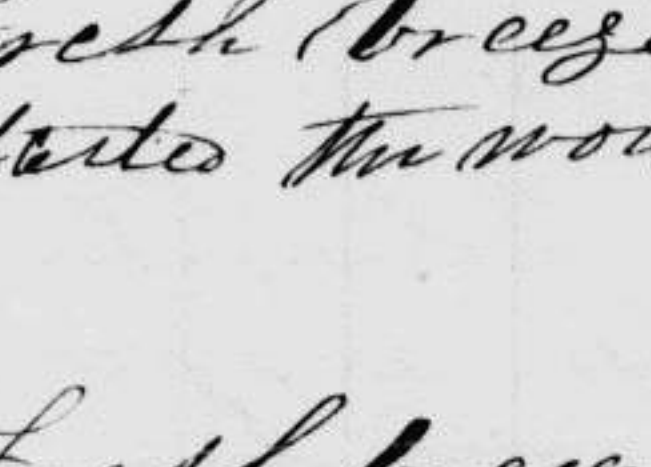
Wednesday July 12th

Light wind N. W. & cloudy at 4 P.M. kept off N. at 5 saw
whales lowered killed one & took him alongside at daylight com.
cutting latter more to S. & cloudy at 12 finished cutting
saw a ship Lat 57 11



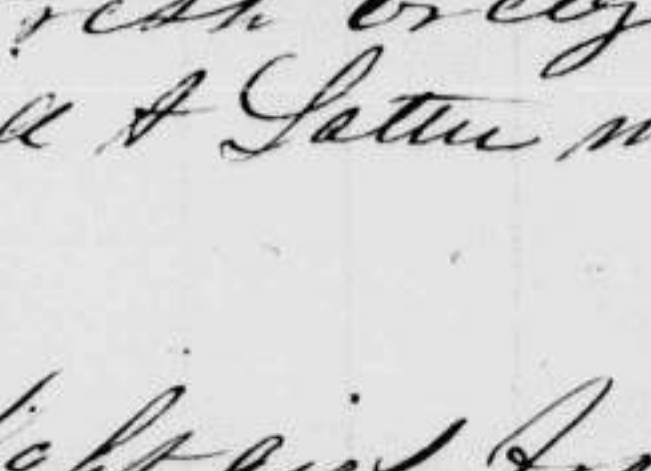
Thursday July 13th

Fresh breeze N. W. & cloudy chased a whale at 9 P.M.
hauled the work mid & latter the same No Ob



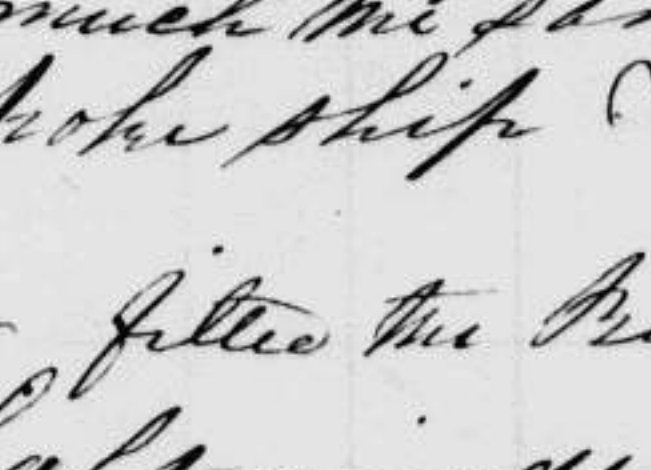
Friday July 14th

Fresh breeze N. W. & thick fog steering E by S boiling
mid & latter weather the same steered S No Ob



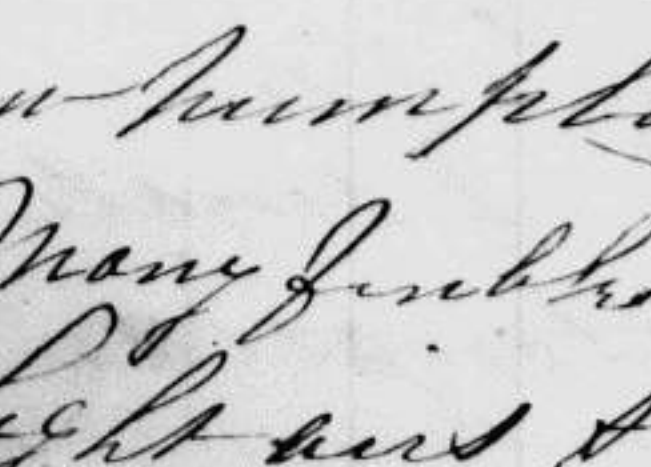
Saturday July 15th

Light wind from the E. & calm thick fog still boiling mid
much the same latter light wind from the N. steering W. by N
spoke ship Waverly 3 P.M. the season Lat 55 11 Long 137 32



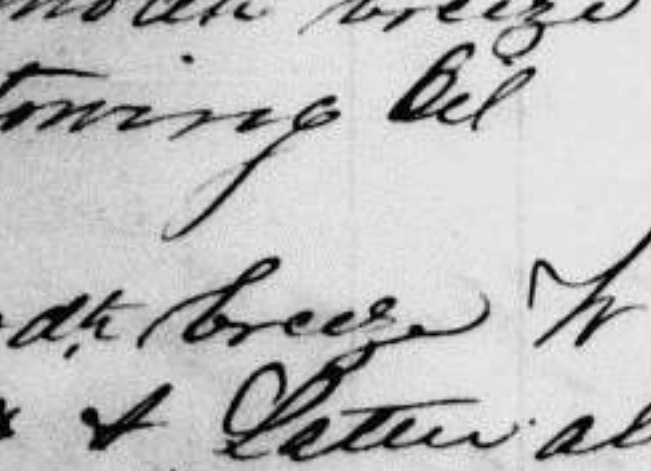
Sunday July 16th

Light wind S. & cloudy steering W. by N finished coaling
saw humpbacked mid & latter the same Lat 56 14



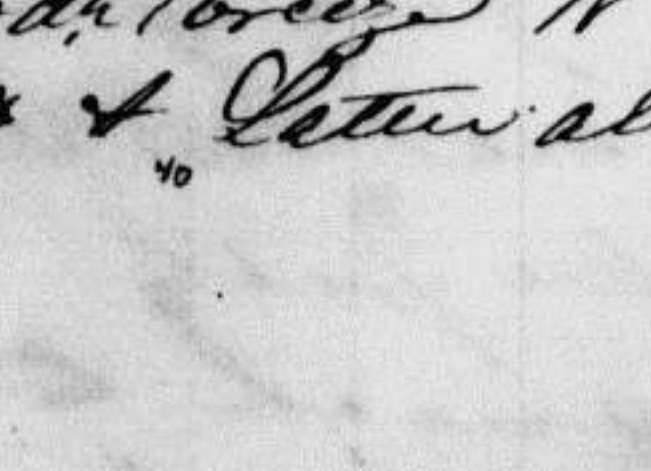
Monday July 17th

Light wind & calm ship Waverly in sight mid & latter
moderate breeze W. N. W. & foggy chased a whale did not strike employed
steering E. broached each (molt) No Ob



Tuesday July 18th

Mod. breeze N. & foggy finished steaming (120 fath.) tacked to the S.
mid & latter about the same opened all bark & fore
