Begins with light air from S S E  
Ship heading S W by W saw grampuses  
Middle Part light winds from the S W  
Latter Part fresh gales from the N E W ships course  
S W by W saw wright whale birds Lat 37.49  
Long

Tuesday Jan the 29<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh gales from N E W  
Ship's course S W by W Middle Part  
a strong gale from N E W Latter Part light  
winds from S S W

Lat 38.37  
Long 44.10

Wednesday the 30<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from S S W  
Middle Part changed to the N E W  
Latter Part strong winds No observation

Thursday Jan the 31<sup>st</sup>

Begins with strong winds from the  
N E W with rain Ship's course S W  
Middle & Latter Part strong gales saw a Barque  
supposed her to be Californian

Begins with strong gales from the S W  
Middle & Latter Parts more moderate  
Saw 2 H. V. V. Lat 41.00  
2 D. & Long 46.30

Sunday Feb the 2<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with light winds from N E W  
Middle Part strong gales from the N E W  
Latter Part much the same Lat 42.26  
Long 48.39

Monday Feb the 3<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with strong winds from the  
N E W Middle Part light winds Latter Part much  
the same Lat 43.20  
Long 49.50

Tuesday Feb the 4<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from N E W  
thick fog ship's course S W Middle Part light  
winds & thick weather Latter Part strong winds  
saw one seal Lat 45.18  
Long 53.13

Wednesday Feb the 5<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh breezes from the  
N E W Middle Part fresh breezes & thick weather  
Latter Part fine weather Lat 46.46  
Long 56.05

Thursday Feb the 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather Latter Part strong  
gales Lat 48.54  
Long 60.00
