 Begins with light winds from S S W

 from Middle & Latter Parts light winds from
 the S S W steering N P by W sent the fore &
 mizen royal-velsels aloft so ends the day
 Lat 39.37
 Long 78.53

Saturday the 9th
 Begins with fresh gales from the S
 steering N P by W saw a Brig steering to the
 Eastward Middle & Latter Parts much the same
 Lat 36.38

Sunday the 10th
 Begins with strong winds from
 the S S W by W saw a ship steering
 N P by E Middle & Latter Parts strong winds
 from the S S E steering N P W so ends this
 day Lat 33.18
 Long 79.05

Monday the 11th
 Begins with strong winds from the S E
 steering N P W by W Middle & Latter Parts the same
 so ends this day Lat 30.27
 Long 80.02

Tuesday March the 12th
 Begins with a fresh breeze from the S E
 steering N P by W Middle & Latter Parts steering
 N P W so ends this day Lat 28.15

Wednesday March the 13th
 Begins with light winds from the
 south steering N P W the wach employed in
 repairing a top-sail Middle & Latter Parts
 light winds from the Southward so ends this day
 Lat 26.14

Thursday the 14th
 Begins with light winds from the southward
 steering N P W Middle & Latter Parts the same
 so ends this day no observation

Friday the 15th
 Begins with light winds from the
 S E steering N P W Middle & Latter Parts
 the same so ends this day Lat 22.16
 Long 85.23

Saturday the 16th
 Begins with light winds from the
 S E steering N P W Middle & Latter Parts
 the same Lat 20.22

Sunday the 17th
 These 24 hours a fine breeze from the
 S E steering N P W Lat 18.10
 Long 87.41 by Lun
 Long 88.40 by Obs
