

Remarks on board in the Month sea.

Monday June the 22<sup>nd</sup> 1850  
Begins with strong winds from the  
South West & clear weather at 7.30  
finished cutting at 4 commenced boiling  
Middle Part from 1 to 4 thick fog but light  
winds from the Westward clear fine weather  
the land in sight the whaler employed in  
boiling so ends this Day in Lat 62.59

Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Begins with light airs & calms & fine  
weather the watch employed as above  
Middle Part light airs & calms ~~the~~ the suns  
upper limb rose this morning at 1.56 above the  
horizon & the lower limb arose at 2.16 being  
20 minutes rising its diameter at 4 A.M finished  
boiling & ships in sight to the North of us  
Land in sight to the Westward so ends this Day  
Lat 62.53  
Long 178.44 East

Wednesday the 24<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with a calm at 3 P.M sounded  
L 62 fathoms of water latter Part light  
airs & calms 15 ships in sight & lots of  
Whales the Larboard Boat got one of them  
Lat 63.05

Thursday the 25<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light airs and calms  
fine weather all hands employed in  
cutting & Whaling the Waist Boat  
got one latter Part employed in cutting  
in the whale so ends this Day

Friday June the 26<sup>th</sup> 1850  
These 24 hours light airs & pleasant weather  
all hands employed in boiling & stowing  
down oil saw but very few Whales

Saturday the 27<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light winds & fine weather  
all hands employed in boiling & stowing down  
spoke the ship Milo of New Bedford with 11  
Whales this season thus ends this Day  
Lat 63.10

Sunday the 28<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with light winds & fine  
weather all hands employed as above  
spoke the ship Victor of New Bedford  
with 4 whales this season saw one whale  
latter Part fine weather saw several whales  
the Larboard Boat got one so ends this Day

Monday the 29<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fine weather all hands  
employed in boiling & stowing down oil  
latter part strong breeze from the South  
East with rain commenced cutting the  
whale took in one lip & half the throat  
so ends this Day

Tuesday the 30<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with a gale from the South  
East with rain & snow all hands  
turned into blanket Bay latter part rainy  
duty weather finished cutting the whale.
