

Remarks on board in the Sea of Anader

Monday July the 1st 1850
Begins with a gale from the Eastward
wet & dirty weather Middle part the same
employed in boiling latter part thick fog
all hands employed in boiling & stowing
down oil so ends this Day

Tuesday the 2^d
Begins with strong winds from the
Eastward all hands employed as above
thick fog rounded had 30 fathoms of water
Middle & latter part thick wet weather saw whales
Lat 64.42

Wednesday the 3^d
Begins with strong wind from the Eastward
wet weather saw Polar Whales & Humpbacks
& fin back the watch employed in boiling
lowered 2 boats without success Latter part
light winds & foggy by sells saw whales
at 11 AM lowered the boats the Larboard Boat
got on & the Waist Boat struck killed & sunk
one so ends this Day

Thursday the 4th
Begins with light airs & calms oceans of
whales in sight all hands employed in
whaling & boiling latter part light airs &
fine weather cut in the whale saw a few
whales in the morning

Remarks of board in the Anader Sea

Friday July the 5th 1850
Begins with light airs & fine weather
all hands employed in bailing & stowing
down & spoke the ship Calapdenia 10
months out with 1300 bbls 50 sp
latter part all hands employed in boiling & sawing
down oil so ends this Day Lat 64.46

Saturday the 6th
Begins with light winds & good weather
all hands employed as above Latter part
saw a few whales lowered the boats the
larboard boat struck one & drew & the waist
boat struck another & drew
sawing down & boiling so ends this Day
the land in sight Lat 64.25

Sunday the 7th
Begins with light winds from the North West
fine weather all hands employed in boiling
& stowing down oil Middle part finished boiling
latter part nothing of note

Monday the 8th
These 24 hours light winds & calms all
hands employed in stowing down oil

Tuesday the 9th
Begins with light winds finished stowing
latter part thick fog so ends this Day
Lat 65.48
