

Remarks on board in the Sea of Anader

Wednesday July the 24th 1850
 Began with fresh breezes from the South East & thick wet weather of hands employed in rebuilding the toy works & set the deck pot & the pot that we got from the Neva launched one of the old pots overboard the other will do for a deck pot middle part strong winds & thick rainy weather finished the toy works latter part more moderate at meridian kindled the fires in the works so ends this Day

Thursday the 25th
 Begins with light winds & good weather the watch employed in boiling middle & latter parts light winds & rain & fog so ends this Day

Friday the 26th
 Begins with light winds & thick dirty weather the watch employed in boiling middle latter parts the same so ends this Day

Saturday the 27th
 Begins with strong gales from the South & foggy at intervals middle & latter parts much the same latter part finished boiling all hands employed in making out the main hole on the larboard side so ends this Day

Sunday the 28th
 Begins with light winds & fair whole weather saw St. Porance Island bearing South East 15 miles distant all hands employed in stowing down oil middle & latter parts the same same this Day

Remarks on board in the Sea of Anader

Monday July the 29th 1850
 Begins with moderate breezes & foggy all hands employed in stowing down oil the devil in the old man middle part thick fog finished stowing down latter part thick fog & rain at 6 AM steering West with a fresh breeze from the North saw a small island bearing South South West one mile distant at 7 saw 4 ships at anchor soon after saw land ahead & on the weather bow & on the lee bow then the old man was loco not knowing where he was tacked ship & steered back where we came in at 11 the wind left us lowered 3 boats & towed the ship to keep her off of the island so ends this Day

Tuesday the 30th
 Begins with light airs from the North thick fog & rain at 1.30 anchored in 24 fathoms of water one mile from the ships land nearly all around us at 2 PM a boat came along side during the afternoon 3 native boats came along side full of natives middle part a breeze came off of the land at 2.45 called off hands & got under weigh & stood out sid saw 3 or 4 ships at anchor at different places so ends this Day
