

Remarks on board in Rearing Stratt's

Tuesday August the 6th 1850
Begins with rainy weather the watch employed in hoiling middle part clear weather & a fresh breeze at 2 P M finished hoiling latter part fine clear weather all hands employed in stowing down oil & chasing whales so ends this Day

Wednesday the 7th
Begins with light winds & fine weather all hands employed in stowing down oil at 6 P M got the ship under weigh & stood off to the South East with a fresh breeze from the westward latter part light all hands employ in stowing down oil at meridian thick misty weather so ends this Day

Thursday the 8th
Begins with fresh breezes from the North East & thick rainy weather ship on the Cox turn took all hands employed in scowing oil middle part moderate breezes steering South East at 5 P M saw St. Lawrence's Island bearing South South East distant 8 miles luffed to the Westward of it latter part light winds & fine weather saw the main land so ends this Day

Friday the 9th
Begins with light airs & calms middle & latter parts fresh breezes from the South West clear weather the watch employed in setting up cask land in sight so ends this Day

Remarks on board in the sea of Anadir

Saturday August the 10th 1850
Begins with a fresh breeze from the South West & clear weather middle & latter parts variable winds from the westward so ends this Day

Sunday the 11th
Begins with a fresh breeze from the West & clear weather one sail in sight middle part light winds latter part squally saw a dead humpback ^{B. head} sounded had 44 fathoms of water so ends this Day
Lat 63° 10' Long 175° 34'

Monday the 12th
Begins with light winds & fine weather the wind from the South West saw humpbacks middle part the wind changed to the South East & thickened up latter part a gale from the North East so ends this Day

Tuesday the 13th
Begins with a dirty North Easter middle & latter parts the same Long 177° 25' W

Wednesday the 14th
Begins with fresh gales from the westward clear weather middle & latter parts strong winds with squalls from the Southward & Eastward middle part light winds from the N. East ~~South~~ latter part at 5 the wind changed to the North at 8 P M squared away to the South saw land bearing North North East the watch employed in scraping whale bone at meridian the wind from the west so ends this Day
Lat 64° 01' Long 176° 22' West
