

Remarks on board off Kamtschataka

Saturday August the 31st 1850

Begins with a fresh breeze from the North East & fine clear weather steering different courses to the southward & westward middle part light airs & calms latter part light winds from the southward land in sight so ends this fine day

Lat 53.30

Sunday September the 1st 1850

Begins with light winds from the Eastward South South West ship heading South East fine clear weather middle & latter parts strong breezes so ends the Day

Lat 54.57

Monday the 2^d

Begins with strong breezes from the South West ship heading South South East middle & latter parts light winds from the South & clear weather

No observation

Tuesday the 3^d

Begins with strong winds from the South & thick weather ship heading East South East middle & latter parts light winds from the South West & thick weather ship on the Eastern tack under short sail

No observation

Remarks on board bound to the Sandwich Islands

Wednesday Sep^r the 4th 1850

Begins with light variable winds from the Westward steering South East by East middle & latter parts light winds & thick weather steering East South East thus ends this Day

No observation

Thursday the 5th

Begins with light winds from the South West & thick weather steering East South East middle part strong winds from the North West with heavy rain latter part fresh breezes & overcast weather thus ends this Day

Lat 49.15

Long 169.22 East

Friday the 6th

Begins with fresh breezes from the North West & overcast weather steering East South East middle part the same latter part light winds the water employed in repairing the fore top gallant sail thus ends the Day

No observation

Saturday the 7th

Begins with light winds from the North West overcast weather steering East South East the water employed in repairing the main top gallant sail middle & latter parts light winds from the North West the fore & main top gallant yards & bent the sails so ends this Day
