

Sunday September the 8th 1850
 Begins with strong winds from the
 North West steering East South East
 middle & latter part a gale from the West
 North West latter part steering East
 by South so ends this Day Lat 15.05
 Long 178.16 East

Monday the 9th
 Begins with a gale from the
 West North West steering East by South
 middle part much the same latter part
 more moderate so ends this Day
 Lat 45.37
 Long 178.40 West

Tuesday the 10th
 Begins with a strong breeze from West
 by North frequent rain squalls steering
 East by South middle part light winds
 from the West steering East latter part
 the same so ends this Day Lat 12.54
 Long 170.15 West

Wednesday the 11th
 Begins with light winds & fine weather
 from the West the watch employed in
 various jobs of ships duty middle
 part the same latter part light airs from the
 South sent up the main royal mast
 & yard
 Lat 22.25
 Long 173.25 West

Thursday September the 12th 1850
 Begins with light airs from the South
 steering East by South employed in drying
 & bundling bone middle part light airs from
 the South West latter part light winds from
 the South East the watch employed as above

Friday the 13th
 Begins with light winds from the
 East South East ship on the Eastern
 tack middle part strong winds from the
 East South East latter part a strong gale
 with rain so ends this Day

Saturday the 14th
 Begins with a gale from the East
 South East middle part a gale from
 the S. South South East latter part
 light winds from the South ship heading
 East South East thus ends this Day

Sunday the 15th
 Begins with light winds from the
 South South East ship heading East
 a very heavy sea middle part light winds
 from the South East with rain latter part
 much the same No observation

Monday the 16th
 Begins with light airs from the South South
 East middle & latter parts the same with a plenty
 of rain No observation
