

Remarks on board bound to the Sandwich Islands

Tuesday September the 17th 1850

Begins with light airs from the south thick rainy weather middle part light winds from the North steering East South East latter part a fresh breeze from the North North East & thick wet weather No observation

Wednesday the 18th

Begins with a fresh breeze from the South East thick wet weather middle part much the same latter part moderate winds & clear weather Lat 42° 10'

Thursday the 19th

Begins with light winds from the Eastward & clear weather middle part foggy latter part clear but a constant head wind Lat 41° 30' Long 167° 28' West

Friday the 20th

Begins with a fresh breeze from the South East ship on the Eastern tack clear weather middle & latter parts much the same so ends this Day Lat 42° 24' Long 165° 28' 05'

Saturday the 21st

Begins with fresh breezes from the South East ship on the eastern tack middle & latter parts fresh breezes from the South South East

Lat 42° 45'
Long 162° 56'

Sunday September the 22^d 1850

Begins with a fresh breeze from the South South East ship heading East middle & latter parts the same so ends this Day Lat 42° 31' Long 161° 01'

Monday the 23^d

Begins with light winds from the South by East ship heading East by South middle part light winds from the South latter part calm

Tuesday the 24th

Begins with a calm caught two sunfish & one shark middle & latter parts light airs from the North & calms overcast No observation

Wednesday the 25th

Begins with light baffling winds middle & latter parts the same this ends this Day Lat 41° 28' Long 158° 58'

Thursday the 26th

Begins with light baffling winds from the Southward the watch employed in bundling bane saw 2 sail as in a middle & latter parts fresh breezes with rain squalls from South West by South one sail in sight Lat 40° 11'
