

Sunday October the 6<sup>th</sup> 1850

Begins with strong winds & rain from East South East middle & latter parts fresh breeze from South East by East

Lat 23.14  
Long 154.30

Monday the 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a fresh breeze from East by South middle & latter parts the same 3 ships in sight  
Lat 21.05

Tuesday the 8<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a strong breeze from the East South in at 6 P.M. saw the Island Oyehee bearing South East at 9 saw the East Snowee latter part ship in the North passage bound in to Lahina so ends this day at 2 P.M. anchored 8 ships arrived

Wednesday the 9<sup>th</sup>

This day all hands employed in various jobs of ships duty took a raft of water cast ashore washed ship & calked the stern of the ship 5 ships arrived

Thursday the 10<sup>th</sup>

This day the starboard watch ashore on liberty the larboard watch employed in various jobs of ships duty

Friday October the 11<sup>th</sup> 1850

This day the Larboard watch on liberty & the starboard watch employed in painting & various other jobs of ships duty

Saturday the 12<sup>th</sup>

This day the starboard watch on liberty the larboard watch employed in shipping whale bone on board the Ram Woron of New York & various other jobs of ships duty

Sunday the 13<sup>th</sup>

This day the Larboard watch went ashore on liberty and wouldn't come on board again

Monday the 14<sup>th</sup>

This forenoon finished shipping the whale bone & the watch refused duty the afternoon all hands ashore

Tuesday the 15<sup>th</sup>

This day the most of the crew ashore the Capt. hired 2 natives to stow water in

Wednesday the 16<sup>th</sup>

This day got 6 natives & a mason setting a post

Thursday the 17<sup>th</sup>

This day had 4 natives to work took some water cask ashore &c
