

Ship Charles Phelps of Stonington Outward Bound 1844

- Wednesday
August the 14
Commences with a fine breeze from S by E and pleasant ship heading S W by W all sail set one sail in sight latter part the same employed in setting up the main maintop and main top gallant fore and aft stays so ends this day

- Thursday
August the 15
Commences with brisk trade winds from S E and pleasant all sail set ship heading S W middle and latter part much the same the watch employed in ships duty
Obs Lat 1.37 N Long 18.22 W
- Friday
August the 16
These 24 hours commences with brisk trade winds from S E and pleasant all sail set ship heading S W middle and latter part wind S E by S ship heading S W by S so ends
Obs Lat 0.18 S Long 19.59 W
- Saturday
August the 17
These 24 hours commences with fresh trade winds from S E by S ship heading S W by S pleasant weather all sail set middle part much the same split the flying jib latter part employed in mending of it so ends this day

- Sunday
August the 18
These 24 hours commences with fresh trades from S E to S by E ship heading S W to S W by W all sail set middle and latter part much the same

- Monday
August the 19
These 24 hours commences with brisk trade winds from S E and pleasant ship heading S W with all sail set middle and latter part ship heading S W by S so ends the day the watch employed in ships duty

- Tuesday
August the 20
These 24 hours commences with brisk trades from S E by S and pleasant ship heading S W by S with all sail set middle and latter part some squally took in the flying jib saw finbacks and jammers so ends

- Wednesday
August the 21
These 24 hours commences with fresh trade winds from S E and pleasant ship heading S W middle and latter part ship heading S by W saw a sail standing to the Northward so ends the watch employed in ships duty

- Thursday
August the 22
These 24 hours commences with brisk trade winds from S E and pleasant ship heading S with all sail set saw finbacks middle part squally took in the fore and mizzen top gallant sails latter part pleasant set them again the watch employed in ships duty

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- Friday
August the 23
This day commences with fresh trade winds from S E and pleasant ship heading S with all sail set middle and latter part much the same saw finbacks so ends
Obs Lat 15.08 S Long 24.10 W
- Saturday
August the 24
These 24 hours commences with brisk trades from S E and pleasant course S all sail set middle part wind from E light squalls of rain latter part wind S E and pleasant the watch employed in ships duty so ends this day

- Sunday
August the 25
These 24 hours commences with brisk trade winds from S E and pleasant steering S with all sail set middle and latter part much the same 2 sail in sight so ends

- Monday
August the 26
These 24 hours commences with brisk trades from E and pleasant course S W spoke the Fame of New London in company with the schooner Garland her tender another sail in sight off the lee bow middle part light winds from the Eastward latter part much the same employed in setting up the main top mast backstays tured in the main top gallant backstays and set them up Mr Ham sick with the fever an ague

- Tuesday
August the 27
This day begins with light baffling winds from the Eastward and pleasant course S W employed in setting up the fore top mast and top gallant rigging latter part a brisk wind from E S E saw finbacks the watch employed in setting up the head rigging so ends
Obs Lat 23.03 S Long 23.15 W
- Wednesday
August the 28
This day commences with a brisk wind from E and pleasant course S W all sail set saw finbacks employed in setting up the main top mast rigging latter part squally with some rain took in the flying jib and mizzen top gallant sail wind from E to E so ends
Obs Lat 25.50 S Long 22.47 W
- Thursday
August the 29
These 24 hours commences with fresh winds from E and some squally course S middle part wind E S E squally and rainy latter part pleasant saw a number of finbacks and Sulphur bottoms the watch employed in ships duty so ends
Obs Lat 28.03 S Long 22.30 W
- Friday
August the 30
These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from S E and pleasant saw several finbacks middle part squally at 10 p.m. took in the flying jib and mizzen top gallant sail at 11 p.m. took in the fore and main top gallant sails at 2 a.m. set the main again at 10 a.m. took it in again blowing fresh so ends
