

Ship Charles Phelps of Stonington Bound North 1845

- Monday
May the 12 This day Commences with light airs from E and calms pleasant weather Steering NW by N middle part the same latter part a fine breeze from SSE long by Sun 178. 40 W Obs Lat 32. 38 N Long 178. 48 W
- Tuesday
May the 13 Commences with a brisk wind from SSE and pleasant Steering NW by N with all sail set Middle part the same latter part strong breeze and squally at 12 am the shifted to NW the ship heading NW by E Obs Lat 33. 41 N Long 179. 17 E
- Wednesday
May the 14 These 24 hours Commences with a fresh breeze from NW and thick weather at 1 p.m. tacked ship heading NW by S at 4 p.m. calm at 5 light wind from NW by N at 2 p.m. the wind from NW ship heading from NW to W by S saw a plenty of Right Whale fed Obs Lat 33. 28 N Long 178. 21 E
- Thursday
May the 15 This day Commences with a fresh breeze from NW by N to NW and overcast ship heading from W by N to NW middle and latter part light airs and calms so ends Obs Lat 33. 36 N Long 178. 05 E
- Friday
May the 16 Commences with a light breeze from E and hazy weather Steering NW by N middle and latter part the wind from SE to SW with squalls of fog Obs Lat 34. 19 N Long 177. 06 E
- Saturday
May the 17 These 24 hours Commences with a fresh breeze from SW and foggy Steering NW by N middle part the wind WSW ship heading NW at 5 a.m. a strong breeze from SW by W heading NW by W took in the top gallant sails thick foggy so ends No Obs
- Sunday
May the 18 This day Commences with a strong wind from SW by W and thick foggy weather Steering NW by W under the top sails and courses middle part more moderate made all sail latter part squally took in flying jib fore & mizen top gallant sails saw 2 humpbacks so ends Obs Lat 37. 13 N Long 175. 20 E
- Monday
May the 19 Commences with a fresh breeze from WSW to W and squally ship heading from NW to NW at 5 p.m. took in main top gallant sail at 3 a.m. double reefed the top sails blowing strong from W ship heading NW by N so ends Obs Lat 38. 43 N Long 175. 30 E
- Tuesday
May the 20 These 24 hours Commences with a strong wind from W and squally weather ship heading NW under double reef top sails and courses middle and latter part moderate wind light and baffling made all sail tacked ship several times Obs Lat 38. 58 N Long 175. 35 E

- Wednesday
May the 21 This day Commences with light baffling winds from W to NW and pleasant ship heading to the northward at 7 p.m. a fresh breeze from W to NW and squally at 10 p.m. took in the top gallant sails at 12 double reefed the top sails at 4 took in jib and main sail at 7 a.m. close reefed the top sail took in the fore sail blowing heavy from W so ends Obs Lat 39. 51 N Long 175. 42 E
- Thursday
May the 22 Commences with a strong gale from NW ship heading to the northward under close reef top sail latter part more moderate shook on reef out of the top sail set fore sail main sail & jib at 7 a.m. wore ship heading NW by N Obs Lat 39. 36 N Long 175. 34 E
- Friday
May the 23 These 24 hours Commences with with baffling winds from NW to NW and overcast ship heading from SW to WSW made all sail middle part light airs and calms latter part a fine breeze from SW by W ship heading NW by W so ends Obs Lat 40. 02 N Long 175. 05 E
- Saturday
May the 24 This day Commences with a fresh breeze from SW and pleasant Steering NW by W with all sail set saw a number of humpbacks and a carcass middle part much the same latter part light winds and foggy so ends Obs Lat 41. 19 N Long 174. 06 E
- Sunday
May the 25 Commences with a light breeze from SW and foggy weather Steering NW by W with all sail set middle part much the same at 6 a.m. blowing fresh from S took in top gallant sails at 9 double reefed the top sails with blowing on at 12 running under double reef main top sail and fore sail so ends
- Monday
May the 26 These 24 hours Commences with a strong gale from S with thick rainy weather Steering NW under double reef main top sail and fore sail the ship hunched into a sea and carried away the starboard quarter davit and stove the boat at 10 p.m. took in the fore sail and hove the top split the main top sail took it in latter lying too under the foot of the spanker blowing very hard with a bad sea wind from W Obs Lat 44. 15 N
- Tuesday
May the 27 This day Commences with a heavy gale from W and very rugged lying to under foot of the of the spanker ship heading NW by N middle part the same latter part it moderated set double top sails fore sail & jib bent a new main top sail Obs Lat 44. 22 N
- Wednesday
May the 28 Commences with light airs from the westward and calms ship heading to the northward at 7 p.m. wore ship heading from SW to NW at 12 p.m. strong breezes double reefed the top sails at 3 a.m. took in the mizen top sail and jib latter part blowing strong with squalls of hail at 8 wore ship to the northward Obs Lat 44. 17 N Long 172. 40 E
