 Wednesday These 24 hours light baffling airs and calms  
 Dec the 10 and pleasant weather on watch ashore of  
 liberty the other employed in Ships duty

Thursday Commences with light northerly winds all  
 Dec the 11 hands employed in Ships duty getting ready  
 for sea

Friday These 24 hours commences with light airs and  
 Dec the 12 Calms at 8 a.m. took our anchor and towed  
 the ship out side of the shipping and  
 let go the anchor again could not get out  
 in the afternoon light southerly wind could  
 not get to sea head wind and tide

Saturday Commences with light airs and calms at  
 Dec the 13 1 p.m. a breeze sprang up from the west  
 ward got under weigh and went to sea  
 just as we were going out the Capt. of the  
 came on board and brought John Smith a  
 man that run away the day after we came  
 in here the Warsaw got under but went  
 back at 7 p.m. a fresh breeze from NW ship  
 heading SW took in the top gallant sails

Sunday These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from  
 Dec the 14 NW and pleasant at 10 p.m. double reefed  
 top sails and hauled up the fore sail a strong  
 breeze from NW steering S at 6 a.m. the weather  
 moderate made all sail and steered E at sun  
 took in top gallant sails and flying bit  
 at dark hauled the ship heading off shore  
 So End

Obs Lat 37.04

on the coast of California December 1845  
 Monday Commences with a light northerly wind and  
 Dec the 15 thick weather ship baying off and on abeast  
 of Monterey at 7 a.m. light airs and calms the  
 Capt went on board of the Warsaw at 10 came  
 on board and steered off S 2 by S with <sup>all</sup> sail set  
 in company with the Warsaw pleasant weather So End  
 Obs Lat 36.46 Long 122.157

Tuesday These 24 hours commences with light baffling winds  
 Dec the 16 and calms pleasant weather steering S 2 by S  
 at 7 a.m. hauled up S 2 by S latter part a fresh  
 breeze from NW steering SE in company with the  
 Warsaw the land distant 15 miles So Ends  
 Obs Lat 36.06 Long 121.347

Wednesday First part of these 24 hours brisk wind from  
 Dec the 17 NW and pleasant weather steering from  
 S 2 to SE Middle and latter part light baffling  
 airs and calms Obs Lat 37.50 Long 120.32

Thursday Commences with light winds from NW to E and  
 Dec the 18 pleasant weather running down the land  
 distant 10 or 12 miles latter part light westerly  
 winds steering SE the watch employed in Ships  
 duty saw finbacks Obs Lat 37.17 Long 120.067

Friday Commences with light northerly winds and pleasant  
 Dec the 19 weather steering through the passage between the  
 Island of St. Rosa & St. Cruz at 12 p.m. hauled  
 too & lay off and on in company with the Warsaw  
 at 9 a.m. sent in 2 boats from each ship to look  
 for Elephant at 7 p.m. came on board found  
 none kept the ship off and steered S 2 by E for the  
 Island of St. Barbara with light winds from NW  
 to NW So Ends
