Tuesday These 24 hours Commences with light winds from  
Dec the 30 N.W. and pleasant weather laying off and on  
at the Cerros Island Middle & Latter airs and calm  
at 5 p.m. stood into the bay and let go an anchor  
in 16 fathoms of water and furled the sails &c

Wednesday These 24 hours Commences with a fresh breeze  
Dec the 31 N.W. and pleasant at 8 a.m. started 2 boats  
each ship to go around the Island to look for  
So Ends

Thursday All of these 24 hours fresh & rather winds and  
Jan the 1 weather at 8 p.m. the boats returned found one  
rookery of Elephants it being on the weather side  
the Island could not <sup>land</sup> we think they are just  
to haul up So Ends

Friday These 24 hours light baffling airs and calm  
Jan the 2 boat ashore fishing and shelling the employed  
wetting hole &c So Ends

Saturday Commences with a fresh breeze from the North  
Jan the 3 and pleasant weather at 8 a.m. took the  
and went round on the East side of the Island  
at 5 p.m. let go the anchor in 74 fathoms  
of water Latter part light baffling winds &c

Sunday These 24 hours light baffling winds and calm  
Jan the 4 pleasant weather 2 boats ashore cruising  
around looking for Elephants &c So Ends

Monday Commences with light airs and calm pleasant  
Jan the 5 weather at 12 a.m. a light breeze sprang up  
the Southward got under weigh and stood off  
Latter part light baffling airs and calm  
So Ends

on the coast of California Jan 1846

Tuesday These 24 hours Commences with a fresh wind  
Jan the 6 from N to N.W. and pleasant weather  
beating round the N end of the Island at 2  
a.m. kept the ship off and steered S by W  
at 6 p.m. steering S.E. the Island of Perrososa  
bearing at distant 15 miles So Ends

Wednesday Commences with a fresh breeze from N.W. and  
Jan the 7 pleasant weather steering S.E. Middle & Latter  
part light winds the watch employed in re-  
pairing sails saw nothing So Ends  
Obs Lat 26.53 N Long 114.09 W

Thursday These 24 hours Commences with light wind from  
Jan the 8 N.W. and pleasant steering S.E. Middle & Latter  
part light baffling airs from N.E. too S.E.  
Ship heading from S.E. to S. employed in mend-  
ing sails saw nothing So Ends  
Obs Lat 25.28 N Long 113.48 W

Friday All of these 24 hours light winds from N.E. to S.E.  
Jan the 9 and pleasant weather ship heading from S.E.  
to S.E. employed in mending sails and wetting  
hole saw nothing Obs Lat 27.30 N Long 111.52 W

Saturday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds  
Jan the 10 and calm pleasant weather employed  
in mending sails saw Bunches & Gram grass  
one seal in sight Obs Lat 27.08 N Long 112.30 W

Sunday These 24 hours Commences with a light from N.W. and  
Jan the 11 and pleasant weather steering S.E. Middle  
and Latter part winds baffling from N.W. to  
N.E. saw Bunches So Ends  
Obs Lat 23.32 N Long 111.38 W
