

Ship Charles Phelps of Stonington
Monday Commences with a light northerly wind
Jan the 12 and pleasant weather steering E by S at 11 A.M.
Saw a shoal of Blackfish lowered 4 boats
and got one middle & latter part baffling wind
from NW to NW by E employed in mending sails the
land in sight Obs Lat 23.03 N Long 110.30 W

Tuesday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds from
Jan the 13 NW to NW by E and pleasant weather steering E
employed in mending sails and wetting hole
at sun down Saw a whale 4 or 5 miles off call
it a sperm whale Cape St Lucas bearing N distant
8 miles So Ends Obs Lat 22.50 N Long 109.43 W

Wednesday These 24 hours commences with a brisk wind
Jan the 14 from W and overcast steering E by S middle &
latter part light winds employed in stowing
the bone in the gun and mending sails Saw
Sunkers & on sail Obs Lat 22.18 N Long 108.18 W

Thursday Commences with a fresh breeze from NW to NW
Jan the 15 and pleasant weather steering E by S latter part
light winds employed in bending the old fore &
sail and repairing the main saw Blackfish
the Maria Islands in sight Obs Lat 21.48 N Long 106.30 W

Friday Begins with a fresh breeze from NW and pleasant
Jan the 16 steering for the Maria Islands at 10 P.M. went
off shore with the main yard aback at 5 A.M.
stood in at 2 P.M. let go the anchor in 16 fathoms
of water on the east side of the middle island sent
2 boats ashore to wood killed 2 Anacondas
one of them measured 11 feet. So Ends

at the Maria Islands Jan 1846
Saturday Commences with a fresh breeze from the
Jan the 17 westward and overcast latter part light
winds all hands employed in wooding
one sail in sight So Ends

Sunday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds and
Jan the 18 calm in the morning the Louisa of New London
stood in and sent a boat ashore found the
Warsaw at anchor on the other side of the
Island So Ends

Monday These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from
Jan the 19 S and rising middle part light winds latter
part a strong breeze from SW with squalls of
rain employed in getting of wood & stowing of it

Tuesday These 24 hours fresh winds with some rain
Jan the 20 employed in getting off wood and stow-
ing of it away So Ends

Wednesday These 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze and
Jan the 21 pleasant weather all of the boats employed
in wooding at 2 P.M. finished which makes
20 boat loads got underway and stood out
the S.E. passage with a light breeze from NW
at 6 P.M. hauled up and steered NW by W So Ends

Thursday All of these 24 hours light winds from NW
Jan the 22 and pleasant weather steering NW by W with
all sail set employed in stowing. So Ends
Obs Lat 21.03 N Long 105.03 W

Friday These 24 hours light winds from NW to NW by E and
Jan the 23 pleasant weather steering NW by S with all sail
set the watch employed in ship's duty saw
nothing So Ends Obs Lat 20.48 N Long 108.20 W
