

Thursday These 24 hours commences with a fresh  
Feb the 19 breeze from the Southward and pleasant  
one watch ashore on liberty at 9 a m the  
weather became very squally blowing strong  
started to dragging let go the Starboard  
anchor and brought her up hove in the L<sup>r</sup>  
anchor found foul cleared it and let it go  
again at sun down moderate the wind from N<sup>W</sup>

Friday All of these 24 hours fresh Northwesterly wind  
Feb the 20 and pleasant weather one watch ashore  
on liberty the other employed in Ships duty  
the Captain ashore sick with the lying fever

Saturday Commences with light Northwesterly winds and  
Feb the 21 pleasant weather one watch ashore on  
liberty the other employed in Ships duty

Sunday Begins with light winds from the Eastward  
Feb the 22 and pleasant weather Middle part fresh  
southerly and squally with rain latter part  
strong winds from N<sup>W</sup> toot at 3 p m gave her  
the second anchor one watch ashore on liberty  
the other employed in Steering away water

Monday Commences with a strong breeze from N<sup>W</sup> toot  
Feb the 23 middle part light winds in the morning  
took the anchors and dropped the ship farther  
out off shore then let the men go ashore to  
to church latter part fresh breeze so ends

Tuesday These 24 hours brisk winds from N<sup>W</sup> toot and pleasant  
Feb the 24 got a new anchor stock for the Larboard anchor  
look in the anchor stock it and put out again  
got off 8 Bbls of Fresh Blatong the Capt. Cannon on board a little  
while to day some better but very weak

Wednesday These 24 hours commences with light winds and  
Feb the 25 pleasant weather latter part fresh breeze from  
the Northward one watch ashore on liberty the  
other employed in getting off recruits all of the liberty  
men came off so ends

Thursday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds and  
Feb the 26 pleasant weather one watch ashore on liberty the  
employed in Ships duty took George Cunningham  
ashore to the Hospital sick caused by eating Castor  
oil beans discharged our 2<sup>nd</sup> mate Mr Ham and  
shipped Mr Durfee in his place and discharged  
Charles Austin sick

Friday These 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather  
Feb the 27 all hands aboard employed in painting  
boats wetting hole &c so ends

Saturday Commences with light southerly winds and  
Feb the 28 pleasant weather latter part the weather  
overcast took up the Starboard anchor and let  
go the Larboard one so ends

Sunday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds  
Feb the 29 and pleasant weather all hands on board  
employed in putting up new Tars for the  
Waist boat and mending the old top galled sails

Monday These 24 hours light baffling winds and  
Feb the 30 pleasant weather most of the crew ashore church

Tuesday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds  
Feb the 31 and pleasant weather employed in  
in mending sails all hands on board  
3 Ships went to Sea & 3 Came in so ends
