on liberty the other employed in ships duty

Friday Commences with a light winds and pleasant
March the 6 weather one watch ashore on liberty
the other employed in ships duty latter
part strong winds from N by W 2 Ships went
to sea and one came in so ended

Saturday Commences with light variable winds
March the 7 and pleasant weather one watch ashore
the other employed in ships duty

Sunday All of these 24 hours light variable
March the 8 winds pleasant weather on watch ashore
the other employed in ships duty 2 Ships came in

Monday All of these 24 hours light variable winds and
March the 9 pleasant weather most of the men went
ashore to the Bethel 6 Ships came in this day

Tuesday These 24 hours light winds and pleasant
March the 10 weather one watch ashore the other employed
in ships duty 2 Ships arrived to day

Wednesday All of these 24 hours light variable wind
March the 11 and pleasant weather one watch ashore
on liberty the other employed in ships duty
2 Ships came in this day

Thursday These 24 hours light air and pleasant
March the 12 weather all hands on board employed in
ships duty one arrival 2 went to sea

Friday All of these 24 hours light air and pleasant
March the 13 weather one watch ashore on liberty the other
employed in ships duty 2 arrivals this day

Saturday Commences with light winds from the northward
March the 14 and pleasant weather one watch ashore the
employed in ships duty one arrival 2 went to sea

Sunday All of these 24 hours light winds and
March the 15 pleasant weather the watch ashore on
on liberty one arrival 3 sailed

Monday 16. Commences with calm pleasant weather. This
watch employed in getting the ship ready for sea. at
11 A.M. took the ship under way with his things
he being discharged at 12 noon Capt. Sanderson took
his chest on shore. He having to stop on account of
sickness. at 1 P.M. the ship was got under way and
stood out in the charge of J. M. White. the former
first Officer. the wind light from N. by E. there is
a third Mate and 8 foremast hands shipped to Liverpool
at 8 P.M. took ship a board of L. H. H. The wind
light through this day.

Tuesday 17. Begins with calm pleasant weather this ship
March the 17. became between the Islands of Maui and
P. H. at 5 A.M. a light air from the northward
the ship stood over towards Maui. At 1 P.M. then took
the wind increasing at sunset she was between the Isles
of P. H. and Maui. Reaching N. H. the wind strong
from N. by E. took in 1000 lbs of provisions and flying jib. The wind
light through this day.
