April 7th The ships course N.E. all sail set weather foggy. at 8 A.M. broke out for head the middle part thick weather the latter part wind rather light weather thick. Course N.E. by E. so ends these twenty four hours in the

April 9th fine weather strong breeze from South at 5 A.M. made sail stand. N.E. by E. the watch employ. in ships duty the middle and latter part pleasant. at 7 P.M. took in sail so ends this day in the

Saturday This day begins with a fine breeze
April 10th from N.E. at 5 A.M. made sail stand. N.E. by E. the weather pleasant & stand N.E. the watch employ. in ships duty at 1 P.M. stood N.E. zigzagging to look for whale the latter part pleasant at 7 took in sail heading N.E. thus ends this day in the
 Latitude of $50^{\circ} 28'$ North
 Longitude of $145^{\circ} 17'$ West

Sunday These twenty four hours begin with a breeze
April 11th from the Northward and Eastward. ship heading to the Westward with all sail set in pursuit of whale saw none the middle and latter part pleasant weather light winds at 7 P.M. took in sail heading to the Westward thus ends this day in the
 Latitude of $53^{\circ} 06'$ North
 Longitude of $145^{\circ} 00'$ West
