Tuesday. Begins with heavy winds from
April 24th. At 5 A.M. all hands made sail stood to the Northward and
Westward under double reef. Topsails fore and
aft. at 8 A.M. in the main topsails at 9 set
a gain at 10 A.M. in the fore and main
topsails bore the ship to the westward, snow
and very cold at 1 P.M. close reefed the
main topsails bore in the fore and main
Latitude of $55^{\circ}22'$ North
Longitude of $147^{\circ}01'$ West

Wednesday. Begins with light winds from
April 25th. The vessel at 5 A.M. made sail
stood along on the wind in search of whales. at 8
A.M. 3 boats for the 30 Whales they were going quick
could not strike. came on board. the weather pleasant
at 1 P.M. bore 3 boats for 30 Whales did not strike
at 1 P.M. bore in sail heading N.W. by E. and
Latitude of $55^{\circ}55'$ North
Longitude of $145^{\circ}40'$ West

Thursday. This day commences with heavy gales from
April 26th. The Eastward. the ship begins to heading
to the Northward and Eastward at 7 A.M. close reefed
the main topsails took in the foresail and wore ship
headed to the Southward the weather being at
1 P.M. the wind shifted to S.E. and moderated at
6 saw four Whales too rugged to lower at 7 set
the main spruce this ends with an Observe

Friday. This day begins with light winds from S.E. at
April 27th. At 5 A.M. made sail at 8 P.M. bore 4 boats
for whole did not strike. at 1 P.M. bore 4 boats
struck came on board bore in sail weather calm
Latitude $56^{\circ}18'$ North
Longitude $147^{\circ}10'$ West

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Saturday. This day commences with light winds
April 28th. from the Southward and Eastward at
5 A.M. made sail stood to the Southward saw several
Whale were ship several times for Whale but they
were going to the windward quick. at 1 P.M. the
wind shifted to the Southward at 7 P.M.
were ship took in sail heading South the
wind from S.E. this ends in the

Longitude of $148^{\circ}10'$ West

Sunday. Begins with light winds from S.W.
April 29th. at 5 A.M. call all hands men sail
shut P.E. at 1 P.M. bore 4 boats for 40 Whales
the P boat struck. the whole run to windward
then mill. the West went and struck got store
to pieces no one hurt. the E boat struck the run
up took them on board of the ship then went to assist
the other boats. the B boats had struck the S boat
was loose the E boats went on and struck got her
bow broken off as far as the bow tract hurt.
Mr. Surfer the mate the Capt took up his
crew and came to the ship then went to help the
B boat but she got loose before the Capt got there
Boats 6 lions one spade by the whole and all of the
E boats craft one tub and line and two crew. the
stern gear of the B boat was broken at 4 took in
the storm boats. got out two more at 7 took in sail
heading S.E. winds from S.E. (No Observe)

Monday. Begins with light winds from the Northward
April 30th. at 5 A.M. made sail stood S.E. the weather
pleasant weather in ship duty the latter part
the wind shifted to the Southward and Eastward. at 7 P.M.
took in sail were ship headed S.W. Latitude $56^{\circ}14'$ North
Longitude $146^{\circ}58'$ West
