Thursday - Begins with strong breeze from E.S.E. at 5 A.M. heavy snow squalls at 7 made sail steered to the southward. at 8 down 8 boats for a whale did not strike come on board. watch employ'd in looking out for water at 9 P.M. down 2 boats for a whale the 3 best struck the first whale. saw several whales at 7 P.M. took in sail heading S.E. by S wind from E.S.E.
 Latitude 56° 46' North
 Longitude 147° 12' West

Friday - This day begins with light winds from E.S.E. the weather calm and pleasant at 4 A.M. made sail. saw three or four whales. 8 boats did not strike come on board. at 7 down 2 boats again went on the whole. at 8 P.M. down 2 boats again went on the whole. at 9 P.M. down 2 boats again went on the whole. the wind strong from the Eastward to a N.W. wind heading S.E.
 Latitude of 56° 11' North
 Longitude of 147° 00' West

Saturday - Begins with strong breeze from East cloudy April 17th weather at 6 A.M. wind increases at 9 close reef the main topsail fine. the four sail and wore ship headed S.E. the weather thick through the fog the latter part more moderate this noon with no observation

Sunday - Begins with strong winds from the Eastward. at 7 A.M. the calm thick weather at 8 wind began to blow from S.W. shot one reef out of the main topsail at 10 the wind heavy close reef the main topsail. the four sail took up the lubber at 1 P.M. posted the main topsail she fitted it set the topsail at 2 took in the 3 best the wind blowing a strong gale at 3 posted main topsail she again fitted it at 4 the wind heavy from S.W. Latitude 56° 11' North

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Monday - This day begins with strong gales May 2nd from the southward and westward ship laying to at 1 A.M. set close reef main topsail at 2 the wind haul'd to E.S.E. at 4 wore ship heading S.E. the latter part more moderate the sea rugg'd saw whale of some kind guess at night
 Latitude of 56° 06' North
 Longitude of 147° 04' West

Tuesday - Begins with heavy gales from the northward May 3rd and eastward. at 10 A.M. the wind haul'd to E.S.E. and the heavy close reef the main topsail failed the four sail weather calm the latter part more moderate at 6 P.M. wore ship set the four sail head E.S.E. wind from South this noon with no observation

Wednesday - Commences with light breeze from N.W. May 4th at daylight made sail steered S.W. at 10 A.M. unbutton the old four sail and bent the new one. at 1 P.M. sent in the jib to repair the latter part squally. saw several humpbacks. at 7 took in sail steered S.E. under double reef main topsail and four sail this noon in the
 Latitude of 55° 58' North
 Longitude of 147° 00' West

Thursday - Begins with a light breeze from W. at 4 A.M. May 5th made sail steered S.E. at 8 down four boats for a whale did not strike at 12 noon come on board wore ship headed N. fresh breeze. watch employ'd in repairing the jib. at 3 P.M. wore ship headed E.S.E. wind from S.E. at 7 P.M. wind fresh from S.E. took in sail ~~steered~~ ship headed S.W. by S
 Latitude of 56° 12' North
 Longitude of 147° 00' West
