

Thursday ^{17th} Begins with light winds from
 May 17th W. S. W. ship heading S. E. at 4
 A. M. made sail at 9 lower of boats for a whale
 did not strike. at 2 P. M. lower of boats again
 the Harbord boat struck the iron snow at
 8 lower of boats again did not strike at sunset
 took in sail weather calm so ends in the
 Latitude of $55^{\circ}26'$ North
 Longitude $148^{\circ}20'$ West

Friday ^{18th} Commences with light winds the weather
 May 18th pleasant weather at 4 A. M. made sail
 heading S. E. the watch employ'd in repairing the
 foresail. at 2 P. M. the wind from W. S. W. lower
 of boats for light whale did not strike saw several
 whale going quick just at night so ends this day
 Latitude of $55^{\circ}28'$ North
 Longitude $148^{\circ}14'$ West

Saturday ^{19th} Begins with light winds from W. S. W.
 May 19th pleasant weather at 4 A. M. made sail
 stand to the Northward. at 9 the wind from W. S. W.
 at 10 lower of boats for whale did not strike watch
 employ'd in mending foresail at 1 past of lower of boats
 for a whale the 1st boat struck the iron snow at 8
 took in sail heading of 6 wind from S. S. E. so ends
 the observation

Sunday ^{20th}
 May 20th begins with calm pleasant weather at 4 A. M.
 made sail at 6 put the 1st boat out. that had
 upon at 2 P. M. a breeze sprang up from S. W. by
 ship heading to the southward and eastward at 4 saw
 a whale lower of boats could not strike at 8 doubt
 if the 1st boat forward aft to run in the greater
 watches. the weather pleasant this ends in the
 Latitude $55^{\circ}55'$ North Longitude $148^{\circ}05'$ West

Monday ^{21st} Commences with strong breeze
 May 21st from S. S. W. ship heading S. E.
 at 4 A. M. made all sail the wind from
 S. S. E. at 10 saw a whale to lower of boats
 it prov'd to be a Humpback. at 2 P. M. the
 wind heavy from S. S. E. clouds up to the top of
 fore and aft at 8 took in sail heading
 S. W. wind from S. S. E. so ends in the
 Latitude $56^{\circ}47'$ North
 Longitude $147^{\circ}43'$ West

Tuesday ^{22nd} Begins with strong breeze from S. S. E.
 May 22nd foggy weather at 6 A. M. made sail
 along on the wind at 10 lower of boats the weather
 thick through the day at 8 P. M. took in sail
 heading S. W. by S. with the 1st boat on board this ends
 the observation taken

Wednesday ^{23rd} Commences with strong winds from
 May 23rd S. S. E. at daylight the weather
 foggy. at 6 A. M. the fog lighted we made sail
 stood along on the wind with the 1st boat on
 board saw several hump and fin backs the
 weather cloudy and squally through the day
 we shall carry all sail through the night
 at 8 P. M. the weather pleasant this ends
 with the observation

Thursday ^{24th}
 May 24th begins with strong breeze from S. S. E. ship
 under all sail heading S. E. at 10 wind increased took in 1st gallant
 flying jib at 12 double up 1st jib fore and aft. at 1
 A. M. took in the main sail jib fore and main top
 the weather fine through the day saw one ship sailing
 at 7 lower of boats headed S. S. E. wind from South this ends
 the observation
