Thursday. Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. at 2 P.M. Ship heading E. & S. at 4 A.M. weather calm and rising. at 6 A.M. light from N.W. made all sail. Steadily East a very heavy sea running. saw one ship. Bent main top gallant. the weather pleasant through the day watch employed in cleaning bone at 8 double reefed the fore and main top gallant sheeting and

Latitude $55^{\circ}47'$ North
Longitude $149^{\circ}11'$ West

Friday. Commenced with light winds from N.W. at 1 P.M. weather at 8 A.M. made all sail. Headed East at 10 the wind hauled to E. & S. E. at 1 P.M. saw two whale boats and chased. Tacked ship at 3 P.M. and chased and chased. could not strike came on board the wind fresh from East. Weather at sunset took in sail. Heading S. & E. This ends in the

Latitude of $55^{\circ}36'$ North
Longitude $147^{\circ}40'$ West

Saturday. Begins with heavy winds from East. May 8th. Ship laying under O. close reefed main top sail and fore topmast staysails the weather thick at 6 A.M. wind (light) from S. & S. W. fog at 12 noon the wind heavy at 3 P.M. took in the foresail close reefed the main top sail at 7 the wind heavy from West. Ship heading South. This ends in the

Longitude of $148^{\circ}10'$ West

June 25, 1844

Remarks upon the voyage while upon the Whale ground

Sunday. Commenced with light winds from May 8th. S. & E. at 4 A.M. made all sail. Steadily East at 9 tacked ship. the wind hauled to East and began to blow fresh. saw four ships at two P.M. double reefed the top sail fore and aft at 2 past two spoke the Tropic of St. James. Capt. Brewster 7 months out with no oil. Capt. White went on board a few minutes then that Capt. Pennington was getting better. at 5 return. took in sail. Heading S. & E.

Monday. Begins with heavy from the East. June 9th. Ship laying under O. close reefed main top sail at 6 A.M. the weather thick. wind ship headed N. & E. at 8 P.M. the wind hauled to S. & W. cloud off. saw made sail. Steadily N. & E. at sunset took in sail. shall run under double reefed main top sail and foresail one ship in sight supposed to be the Tropic. This ends with no observation

Tuesday. Begins with with strong winds from June 10th. the southward at 4 A.M. made all sail. Steadily to the northward. at 8 sent down the main top sail to repair at 11 but it spoke the German of Bedford Capt. Shorley two whale this season the middle part strong breeze from E. & S. at 5 P.M. spoke the Concordia of Sag Harbour (Capt. Loper 8 months out 50 bbls of blubber oil. at 8 took in sail. heading South. weather foggy this ends in the Latitude of $55^{\circ}58'$ North

Longitude of $148^{\circ}20'$ West
