

Remarks while cruising on the Northwest Coast in 1848

Friday. Commenced with strong breeze from West June 12th rugged weather at daylight made sail steady. Sailed at 8 A.M. where the -
P. B. U. D. of Massachusetts (Capt. at anchor)
10 minutes out and in hole this screen the middle
X part foggy at 1 P.M. left of E. S. E. at 2 -
saw 2 fair boats for 2 Whales without success
at sunset took in sail the weather cleared out
this was in the - Latitude of $53^{\circ}05'$
Longitude of $145^{\circ}35'$ West

Saturday. Begins with light breeze from E. S. E. June 13th fair weather. at 4 A.M. made sail steady. S. E. at 5 & M. lower 4. Boats for 2 Whales without success. at 7 past 10 (bowed 4 boats
X for 2 whales the 1 boat struck. one now broke
the sheet was parted. did not save the whale
at 5 P.M. saw three whales going quick. at 9
took in sail heading N.W. wind from W. S. W.
Latitude of $52^{\circ}14'$ North
Longitude of $146^{\circ}01'$ West

Sunday June 14th Commenced with light winds from S. S. E. at 8 A.M. made sail steady to the eastward at 11
O.M. saw ship the middle and latter part foggy.
this was. - - - Latitude of $52^{\circ}25'$ North

Monday. Begins with light breeze from S. S. E. June 15th at 8 A.M. made sail steady to the eastward
the weather foggy. at 2 P.M. spoke the Barque -
America of New Bedford Capt. Eastman nothing this saw
at noon took in sail heading N.W. this was
in the Latitude of $52^{\circ}33'$ North
Longitude of $147^{\circ}48'$ West

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Tuesday. Begins with light breeze from June 16th North. S. A.M. made sail steady
(N. N. W. weather pleasant. saw one whale). saw
one ship the middle and latter part pleasant
light winds from. N. N. W. at sunset doubled
up. tops fore and aft. this was in the
Latitude of $53^{\circ}02'$ North
Longitude of $147^{\circ}17'$ West

Wednesday. Commenced with light winds from June 17th S. W. at 8 A.M. made sail steady
to the northward and westward. at 9 spoke the
Sloop of N. London. Capt. Ward then whale
this season. at 1 P.M. saw N. E. saw no whale
at sunset doubled up. the tops. steady. East
this ends with no observation -

Thursday. Begins with light winds from N. June 18th ship leaving from North to S. E.
at 7 A.M. lower 4. Boats for 2 whales that had
an iron in him could not strike this weather
pleasant the middle and latter part this same
at sunset took in sail heading East. this
was in the Latitude of $53^{\circ}49'$ North
Longitude of $147^{\circ}22'$ West

Friday June 19th Begins with light westerly winds
pleasant weather at 8 A.M. made sail steady
to the eastward. saw several hump backs no whales
saw one carcass. the latter part light winds
from S. E. at sunset took in tops. at 10
tops heading E. S. E. this was in the
Latitude of $53^{\circ}59'$ North
Longitude of $146^{\circ}24'$ West
