

Remarks while upon the N.E. coast in June 1846

Sunday - Begins with light S.E. winds. ship
June 28th. Heaving S.W. at 9 A.M. toward
three boats for eight whales the S boat struck whale
sounded took the line. the boat went on and struck
the same whale and parted. then I boat struck and
X parted. - went on and struck again the whale
brought too the S boat joined up her line and the
whale at 1 P.M. took it a long side at 3 commenced
cutting. at 8 finished. took in sail water employ. in
cleaning up decks. thus ends the observation -

Monday. Commences with calm foggy weather at
June 29th. - 1 A.M. started the work. at 4 A.M. light
breeze from S.W. set the topsails. Heaved S.W.
saw two ships water employ. in boiling the mackerel
and latter part pleasant. at 7 P.M. the offing the
masts of the Mobile of New Bedford. Capt Sumner
came on board to buy craft we had none to spare
she had one whale this season. at sunset took in
sail won ship. thus ends the observation

Tuesday. Begins with strong breeze from N.W.
June 30th. the water employ. in boiling at 4
A.M. made sail. then S.W. the weather foggy
through the day at intervals at 6 P.M. finished
boiling. at sunset took in sail. weather calm

Wednesday

Longitude of $145^{\circ} 38'$ West

July 1st. Commences with strong breeze from S.W.
at 8 A.M. made sail. headed N.E. water employ. in storing
mackerel. the middle and latter part thick weather
wind heavy at 4 P.M. took in sail. at 8 finished. storing mackerel
stored 160 bbls in the mackerel hold. won ship headed
south thus ends in the Latitude of $53^{\circ} 28'$ North

Remarks while upon the N.E. coast in July 1846

Thursday. Begins with thick morning weather
July 2nd. heavy wind from N.W. at 6
A.M. made sail. headed N.W. at
10 took in sail at 4 past 11 set topsails
at 12 P.M. spinn the ballastium
of N. London Capt McLean. 5 whales
this season at 1 P.M. took in sail won
ship headed south. thus ends

No observation -

Friday. Commences with heavy winds from the
July 3rd. continued thick weather. did not make
sail. at 8 A.M. won ship water employ. in
washing ship. at 1 P.M. employ. in cleaning
bow. at 8 won ship. the latter part thick
weather thus ends in the

Saturday

No Longitude

July 4th. Begins with calm thick weather
did not make sail water employ. in backing
out for water. the middle and latter part
thick. at 7 P.M. the wind from N.W.
saw two ships thus ends no observations

Sunday. Commences with strong breeze
July 5th. from N.W. at 8 A.M. made
sail. then to the southward. saw 3 ships at
1 P.M. weather foggy. at 6 the fog lifted
up saw two or three going to the windward
ground. at sunset took in sail won
ship headed N.W. under double reef. topsails
