Monday. Begins with thick weather light  
July 6<sup>th</sup> - winds from N. N. W. ship heading  
to the northward at 1 P.M. set whole topsails  
and main topgallant. The latter part thick at  
8 took in said heading N. W. thus ends

July 7<sup>th</sup> - weather did not make sail  
the middle and latter part the same

July 8<sup>th</sup> Begins with thick weather light winds  
from East. at 9 A.M. wind blows fog lighted up  
made sail star. & P. E. at 1 P.M. wind heavy  
weather rainy took in sail close up. The main  
top sail at 7 the wind heavy from E. N. E. weather  
rainy saw a Barge going before the wind under  
canvas up. Mountain and forest. Thus ends

July 9<sup>th</sup> Commences with heavy rain  
from the Eastward. thick foggy weather  
did not make sail. Ship heading to the

at 1 P.M. spoke the Mariner of Nantes  
Capt. Palmer. two whales this season. The
