Wednesday - Commenced with strong breeze from July 15th - (West at 4 A.M. made sail steered S.E. saw no whale the middle and latter part pleasant sounds in the

Latitude of $58^{\circ}03'$ North
Longitude $143^{\circ}23'$ West

Thursday

July 16th begins with strong breeze from N.E. at 4 A.M. made sail steered S.E. & the sea raged. at 12 o'clock kept off to S.E. at 2 P.M. spoke the ship Hamilton of Bedford Capt. Fisher 6 whales this season Capt. White went on board had mate come outboard of us. we steered S.E. at 8 o'clock reefed the topsails fore and aft shall steer East through the night thus was in the

Latitude of $52^{\circ}58'$ North
Longitude of $139^{\circ}00'$ West

Friday

July 17th Commenced with strong winds from West at 4 A.M. made sail steered S.E. & the middle and latter part the same so was in the

Latitude of $52^{\circ}18'$ North
Longitude $137^{\circ}00'$ West by Capt.

Saturday

July 18th begins with strong breeze from S.E. to S.W. the weather foggy at intervals ship heading from S.E. to S.W. the middle part pleasant. the latter part thick fog. saw no whale this was the day in the

Latitude of $50^{\circ}59'$ North
Longitude of $137^{\circ}15'$ West

Sunday Commenced with strong gales from July 19th S.W. at 4 A.M. made sail steered S.E. & at 10 o'clock reefed the topsails fore and aft the middle and latter part heavy winds rough weather at 8 P.M. took in sail so was no observation

Monday

July 20th begins with strong western winds at 4 A.M. made sail headed to the Southward. saw no whale. the middle and latter part squally at 8 P.M. took ship headed to the Northward. double reefed the topsails fore and for the night thus was in the

Latitude of $48^{\circ}34'$ North
Longitude $136^{\circ}33'$ West

Tuesday

July 21st commenced with light winds from West at 4 A.M. made sail headed S.E. & saw Grampuses. no whale the middle and latter part very light winds from N.E. at 5 P.M. steered South at 6 took in sail

Latitude of $48^{\circ}18'$ North
Longitude $137^{\circ}25'$ West

Wednesday

July 22nd begins with light winds from N.E. at 4 A.M. made sail steered S.E. & the weather pleasant saw one finback. the middle part a fine breeze the latter part rather thick the watch unpleasant in rearing moor in the fore at 8 P.M. took in sail heading N.E. wind light thus was in the

Latitude of $47^{\circ}51'$ North
