

Remarks upon the new coast in July 1846

Thursday

July 25th Commenced with light winds from N.W. at 4 A.M. made sail steady S.W. the weather pleasant saw no whale the middle and latter part the same. at 5 P.M. sent the old fowls and sent the new one at 8 took in sail heading S.W. so ended in the

Latitude of $47^{\circ} 09'$ North

Longitude $183^{\circ} 25'$ West

Friday

July 26th Begins with light winds from N.W. at 4 A.M. made all sail steady W.S.W. the weather pleasant at 10 left off to S.E. saw no whale at 4 past two P.M. haul aboard for something supposed to be sperm whale but it proved not to be the latter part light winds pleasant weather at 8 took in sail

Longitude $189^{\circ} 27'$ West

Saturday

July 26th Commenced with a fine breeze from N.W. at 4 A.M. made all sail steady S. the weather pleasant saw no whale the middle and latter part the same. we shall carry sail tonight having concluded to leave the ground

Longitude $189^{\circ} 09'$ West

Sunday

July 26th Begins with a fine breeze from N. the ships course W by N. all sail set pleasant weather saw no whale middle and latter part the same

Longitude $180^{\circ} 09'$ West

Remarks upon the passage to Maui in 1846

Monday the Commenced with strong breeze from July 27th S. & W. ship heading S.E. with a view to set at 11 A.M. split the old fowls & galleons sent at noon sent a new one at the fore and main took in flying jib at 12 O.M. took in fowls gal at 3 P.M. wind heavy weather rainy at 3 took in main top galleons at 7 could only top the fore and aft thus ended the observation

Tuesday Begins with heavy winds from S. & W. July 28th ship under double reefed tops fore and aft at 1 A.M. the wind hauled to N. set whole tops and main top galleons. steered S. by W. the weather squally through the day at 5 P.M. sent new fowls & galleons so ended in the

Latitude of $40^{\circ} 14'$ North

Longitude $189^{\circ} 20'$ West

Wednesday

July 29th Commenced with heavy winds from the Westward. ship heading to the Westward under all sail at 4 A.M. weather squally took in top galleons fore and aft and reefed main tops. at 6 set them again the middle and latter part pleasant at 5 P.M. set the fore topmast studds. wind light from N.W.

Longitude of $189^{\circ} 25'$ West

Thursday

July 30th Begins with light baffling winds pleasant weather water employed in ships duty at 1 P.M. saw new main braces. at 4 water employed in bunching bows. The latter part a fine breeze from N.W. ships course E by N. West. Latitude $37^{\circ} 56'$ North

Longitude $189^{\circ} 50'$ West
