Remarks upon the passage from the Newcom

Sunday the Commences with strong trade  
August 9 winds. squally weather. the ship  
under all sail coasting S. S. M.  
the middle and latter part light winds  
squally weather comm. S. S. by S. S. winds  
Latitude of  $21^{\circ} 09'$  North  
Longitude of  $155^{\circ} 02'$  West

Monday the  
August 10 Begins with fine trade winds  
ships come from S. S. by S. to S. S. S.  
the watches employ. in ships out. the middle  
and latter part pleasant at 7 P. M. supper.  
the ship to be about 50 miles from Maui  
Latitude  $20^{\circ} 49'$  North  
Longitude of  $154^{\circ} 57'$  West

Tuesday the  
August 11 Commences with strong trade ship  
under all sail steering N. by S. at 8 A. M. we  
yach. ourselves near the land haul about the  
main G. S. till 8 then saw the Island of Maui  
Kept off for the east and made all sail -  
weather squally at 10 got the chain up and  
bent them at 5 took in Stuvitz. and topgallants  
in a squall off of Maunaloa at 6 with down?  
4 boats to tow the ship at 7 past 8 left -  
Bendleton came on board with the American  
Consul. and Harbour Master. at 7 past 4 let  
go anchor in 15 fathoms of water. at the  
port of Lahaina Maui. and fuel. so ends this day

Remarks while laying at the port of Lahaina

Wednesday Commences with very hot pleasant  
August 12 weather. the S. watch on shore on  
Liberty. the S. watch employ. in scraping and  
painting the S. bands of the ship and getting a rope  
of cable on shore &c. thus ends this day

Thursday Commences with pleasant weather  
August 13 at 4 A. M. got off deck of water  
the S. watch on Liberty. S. watch employ. in  
stowing water &c. thus ends one day and to day

Friday Begins with pleasant weather at  
August 14 at 4 A. M. got off 75 bls of water  
at 7 the S. watch went on shore S. watch  
employ. in painting the ~~lower~~ starboard ends  
of the ship. stowing water &c. this ship coming  
in so ends this day at Lahaina

Saturday Commences with pleasant weather  
August 15 the S. watch employ. in stowing  
water. the S. watch on Liberty. two ships  
came in to day. so ends this day

Sunday the Begins with pleasant weather  
August 16 the watches went on shore to check  
several ships came in to day as usual

Monday the Begins with pleasant weather  
August 17 the watches on Liberty. at 11 A. M.  
discharge. Crew. McGinty and John. Carter for  
Bates for misconduct. also. Mackenz. & Kanaka  
two ships went out to day thus ends
