Tuesday Commences with pleasant weather
 Augt 13. The 3rd bottle contributed to the 8th water
 imple in getting off inside. That in 21 Bbls
 of Irish and 18 Bbls of sweet potato. Vessels
 Mr. Dwyer. by mutual consent one ship gone
 out to sea - at 3 P.M. Capt Barker of the
 Ship "Thetis" of Bedford, was beside side
 of pulmonary disease so much

Wednesday Commences with fine weather
 Augt 14. All hands on board getting ready
 for sea. Ship three men two ship's sail.
 to sea. so much this day

Thursday Commences with pleasant weather
 Augt 15. The ship ready for sea, but will
 be detain'd for a day on account of the 8th water
 being sick. an attack of of the cholera the
 doctor has been to see him and has administered
 to him water. so much this day

Friday Commences with calm pleasant
 Augt 16. weather at 5 A.M. call
 all hands pump ship the sail now being
 better. we took the anchor and tove
 the ship out. at 8 P.M. Capt Brewster
 on board. saw a Breeze in the passage
 that prov'd to be the "Warrior" of Stonington
 Capt Brewster. Capt Brewster on board. He
 has been two five and one week since this
 season at 4 P.M. Capt Brewster and we provided
 all hands employ'd in stowing anchors &c. Latter part
 winds light and baffling one sail in sight at
 sun down Kaurai bearing 8 distant 20 miles

Ship Charles Phelps of Stonington Bound South 1845

Saturday These 24 hours commences with strong
 Augt 22 trades from N.E. to E.N.E. Steering S.E. by S. Latter
 part light baffling winds and pleasant
 weather the watch employed in Ship's duty
 saw nothing this day. No Obs

Sunday All of these 24 hours light baffling winds and
 Augt 23 pleasant weather steering S.E. with all sail
 set Owyhee in sight also on sail at sun
 down the S point of Owyhee bearing S.E. distant
 20 miles. Obs Lat 19.20 N Long 156.22 W

Monday Commences with light baffling airs and calm
 Augt 24 pleasant weather at 12 P.M. a breeze sprang
 up from N.E. steering S.E. at 2 P.M. took in the
 flying Gib & Mizzen top gallant sail middle & latter
 part brisk trade winds from S.E. to E by N. saw
 nothing. Obs Lat 18.12 N Long 155.52 W

Tuesday These 24 hours begins with brisk trade winds
 Augt 25 from E to E.N.E. and pleasant ship heading
 from S.E. to S.S.E. with all sail except flying Gib
 & Mizzen top gallant sail middle part squally
 Latter pleasant the watch employed in making
 spun yarn saw nothing so much. Obs Lat 16.18 N Long 155.14 W

Wednesday Begins with brisk trade winds from
 Augt 26 E and pleasant weather ship heading
 S.E. with all sail set Latter part some
 squally at 5 P.M. took in flying Gib & Mizzen
 top gallant sail the watch employed in making
 spun yarn saw nothing this day. Obs Lat 14.14 N Long 154.47 W
