

Ship Charles Phelps of Stonington

Monday All of these 24 hours strong gales from NW
Nov. the 23 To NW and Ship lying too under close
reef main top sail & fore sail at 11 AM
wind hauled to SE were ship heading W
So ends 9 sail in sight

Obs Lat 44.31 S Long 76.35 W

Tuesday Commences with a strong breeze from SE & ship
Nov. the 24 heading W at daylight made sail at 8 AM
lowered for a whale without success at 10
lowered again fastened the whale dunnies
and parted the line later part pleasant
at 7 PM spoke the Barge Belonging of Stoni-
ngton 250 bbls at 8 the Caledonia of Stonington
run down and spoke us 5 months out 400 bbls
So ends

Obs Lat 43.56 S Long 77.11 W

Wednesday Begins with a fresh breeze from NW ship
Nov. the 25 heading SE at daylight set the top sails
& fore at 11 AM strong breeze double reefed
the top sails & took in fore lowered for a
+ Right whale without success at 2 PM
took in fore & mizen top sail close reefed
then main blowing a strong gale thick dirty
weather So ends

Thursday These 24 hours commences with a strong gale
Nov. the 26 from NW ship heading SE thick squally
weather at 6 AM more moderate set double
reef fore & mizen top sails the wind ^{shifted} more SE
at blew on took in fore & mizen top sails at
1 PM took in the fore sail blowing a heavy
gale from SE ship heading NW So ends
one sail in sight

Cruising for whale on the coast of Chili November 1845

Friday Commences with a heavy gale from SE ship heading
Nov. the 27 WSW under close reef main top sail at 7 AM more
moderate set the fore sail at 2 PM spoke the
Conada of New Bedford 4 months out 250 bbls later
part thick & rainy

Obs Lat 43.41 S

Saturday Begins with a strong gale from SE and thick
Nov. the 28 weather ship heading SE at daylight moderate
weather and fog squalls made sail from SE
to SE at 4 PM tacked ship heading NW at sun
down shortened sail light and saw no right
whale this day 6 sail in sight 82 fimbarks

Obs Lat 44.05 S Long 76.18 W

Sunday These 24 hours commences with light wind from
Nov. the 29 SE and fog squalls ship heading NW at daylight
made sail at 7 AM tacked ship heading from SE
+ SE at 5 PM saw a right whale lowered without
success at sun down shortened sail So ends 5 sail
in sight

No Obs Lat

Monday Commences with light winds from SE and
Nov. the 30 fog squalls ship heading SE at daylight
made sail with a breeze from SE ship heading SE
+ Saw several whale lowered 3 times but could not
get fast at 5 PM tacked ship off shore the land
distant 20 miles at sundown double reefed the top sails
heading NW 18 sail in sight one cutting 82 boiling So ends

Obs Lat 44.20 S Long 75.50 W

Tuesday Begins with light winds from SE to SEW and
Nov. the 1 fog squalls ship heading W to WSW at daylight
made sail with light winds and pleasant at 6 PM
spoke the Columbus of New London 5 months out 5 whale
at sundown shortened sail
Saw no whale this day 18 sail in sight

Obs Lat 44.18 S Long 77.03 W
