

St. Carlos Thursday Jan 27th 1848

Light winds from the N. Blackbird the Pens. and
Shoring wood and water all day. Night good weather
a watch on liberty.

Friday Jan 28th Light winds from the N and
good weather. A watch on liberty. Employed in shoring
down wood and water and sent a raft on shore.

Saturday Jan 29th Strong winds from the W and
foggy. Got off a raft of water and shoring wood and blacking
the rigging. A watch on liberty. Mr. Levy took his things and
left the ship and went ashore at St. Carlos.

Sunday Jan 30th Light winds from the W and shower
a watch on liberty. William Oving deserted and John Senti

Monday Feb 1st Flowing strong and showery
Shoring down wood and water and blacking rigging.
Master Manning deserted. Discharged our cook William Quinn.
Mr. Levy joined the ship again.

Tuesday Jan 25th Light winds and showers. Shoring down wood and
water. Got off a raft and stored it down.

Wednesday Jan 26th Northerly winds and showers. After
noon cleared up. Unbent the fore and main top sails and began mending
them. All hands on board. Night flowing hard and rainy.
Got off a raft for a fly jib boom. Caught John Senti.
Shipped Charles Orell.

Thursday Jan 27th Flowing a norther with rain. All
hands on board. Afternoon mending sails and making boom.

Friday Jan 28th Showery. Mending sails and
sent out the fly jib boom.

Saturday Jan 29th Flowing a norther and
raining. Caught our 2 deserters and brought them on board
and punished them.

Ship Charles Phelps Sunday Jan 30th 1848

Light winds from the W and good weather. Got all ready
for sea. Middle part weather the same. Latter part a light
wind from the N. At 5 hove up our anchor and got under
weigh from St. Carlos in company with the Eugene. Light
winds. At 12 St. Carlos heads bearing E distant 10 miles.

Monday Jan 31st Light winds from the S and good
weather. Steering N.W. all sail set. At 2 took in main
sail and miz. top of sail. At 4 took in fore and main top of sail
for the E. kept up. Saw many humpbacks. At 8 set main
top of sail. Middle part fresh breeze and good weather.
Latter part strong winds. Took in top of sail. Employed in
drawing yarns and making spun yarn. Blackfish 139.10

Tuesday Feb 1st Strong breeze from the S and puffed
steering N in company with C. for Mocha. Saw a large working
S. Employed in drawing yarns and making spun yarn. Saw
Blackfish. At 6 hauled off by the W under aback reefed top sails
blowing strong. At 12 hove back again. Moderated. Latter part
set all sail. Heading in to the E. S. for Mocha. Three sail in
sight. At 10 running down the land. At 12 double reefed
the top sails.

Wednesday Feb 2nd Flowing strong and squally. Working up to the land
in company of the Eugene, Neugart and Imperger. Set double
reefed top sails. At 3 the Captain went on shore for recruits.
Dining off and on. At 4 the Captain came on board. Moderated.
Middle part strong breeze. Latter part flowing a smart
gale. Working up to the land. At 9 Capt went on shore.

Thursday Feb 3rd Flowing strong from the S. Lying
off and on Mocha getting off potatoes. At 6 Capt came
on board. Middle part thick drizzle weather. Latter
part light wind from S. cleared up. At 8 Capt went on shore
Got off 10 barrels of potatoes.

Friday Feb 4th Strong breeze from S.E. Lying
off and on Mocha. At 3 the Captain came on board with
110 barrels of potatoes. At 5 squared in the yards and
drum mizzen. At 6 set main top of sail. Middle part flowing
strong and puffed. At fore top of sail. Latter part weather the
same. Unbent the chains and stowed them below and sent
down main sail to repair. 35.58
