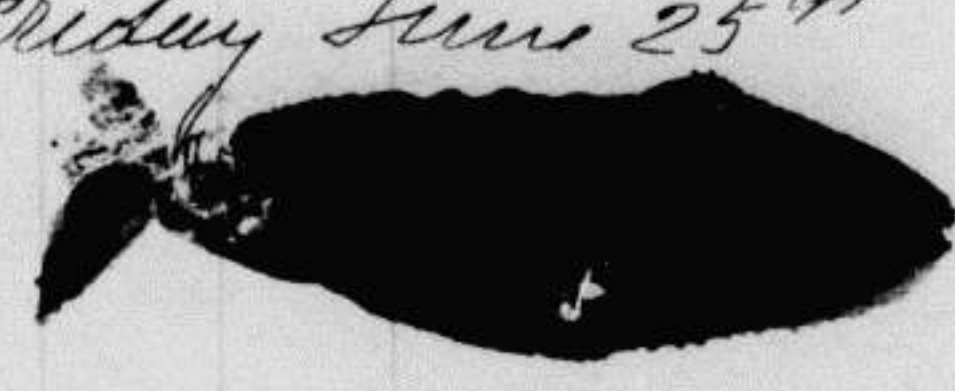


Log Book of Ship Chat Phelps of Haverington Billings Burtch Master

622	Wednesday June 16 th Spoke Ship Chas. Brothers no oil Saw Jonas Is. Bearing S. E. distant 3 miles	Commenced with pleasant weather from S. crew employed at cutting our blubber finished at 6 P.M. Blubber room full of fresh blubber & a dark load of blasted blubber. A.M. employed at boiling blasted blubber, saw two whales, Lat. 4, 5, 56.50
623	Thursday June 17 th Jonas Is. Bearing S. E. distant 15 miles	Commenced calm, no whales in sight, crew employed at boiling blasted blubber, A.M. calm.
624	Friday June 18 th Saw Jonas Is. bearing S. E. distant 15 miles Spoke Ship Noquel, 8 whales	Commenced calm, crew employed at boiling saw several whales, a going quick to S. Several ships in sight & all a boiling, A.M. employed at cooping pipes, saw no whales
625	Saturday June 19 th Stowed down 20 pipes of oil, 44	Commenced with pleasant weather, crew employed at stowing down pipes & boiling, A.M. employed at boiling & cooping pipes, saw no whales Lat. 4, 5, 56.50
626	Sunday June 20 th Stowed down 14 pipes of oil, 58	Commenced with pleasant weather, crew employed at boiling & stowing down pipes, saw no whales A.M. light rain
627	Monday June 21 st Saw Jonas Is. bearing S. E. by E. Spoke Mary Gradier 8 whales	Commenced with moderate breezes & fine rain, crew employed at boiling, A.M. weather the same, finished boiling, saw no whales, crew employed at cooping pipes
628	Tuesday June 22 nd Stowed down 14 pipes of oil, 72	Commenced with thick rainy weather, from S. crew employed at stowing down oil, A.M. weather the same
629	Wednesday June 23 rd Spoke Ship Rodman, 4 whales " " Napachusella of N.B. clear Stowed down 14 pipes of oil, 86	Commenced with moderate breezes & thick weather, saw no whales, the last of P.M. & fine of A.M. strong breezes from S. W. saw no whales Lat. 4, 5, 55.50 Long. 4, 142.15
630	Thursday June 24 th at 11 A.M. struck a whale & drew	Commenced with pleasant weather from S. W. steering S. saw great quantities of hump backs, but no whales at 2 P.M. fell in with a large body of whales, at 3 A.M. all hands & commenced chasing killed whale & struck him.



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631	Friday June 25 th 	Commenced with pleasant weather & plenty of whales in sight crew employed at whaling, at one P.M. struck a whale that went 25 miles to windward killed him & took him alongside at 9 P.M. at 4 P.M. rain, A.M. employed at cutting our whale, con- tinued rain, saw plenty of whales & ice
632	Saturday June 26 th Spoke Ship Tiger one whale	Commenced with moderate breezes & rain from S. crew employed at cutting finished at one P.M. plenty of whales about, saw the ice bearing W. distant 2 miles A.M. a strong gale from S. together with rain
633	Sunday June 27 th	Commenced with a gale of wind & rain storm from S. saw plenty of whales, the gale con- tinues all A.M.
634	Monday June 28 th Spoke Ship Napachusella of N.B. 4 whales	Commenced with a gale of wind & rain storm from S. saw several whales A.M. the gale broke, but it still continues to rain & fog, with a strong breeze from S. E.
635	Tuesday June 29 th	Commenced with a strong breeze from S. E. with rain & fog, ship under double reef main topsail. fore sail, crew employed at boiling, A.M. quiet moderate, but a thick fog.
636	Wednesday June 30 th Saw 4 ships	Commenced with light airs & a thick fog from S. E. crew employed at boiling, A.M. calm, saw no whales
637	Thursday July 1 st	Commenced with clear calm weather crew employed at boiling, saw no whales A.M. some fog, Lat. 4, 5, 55.50 Long. 4, 142.15
638	Friday July 2 nd Spoke Mary Gradier, 9 whales 	Commenced with light airs, from S. ship steering S. saw no whales, the last of P.M. & A.M. steered S. E. at 8 A.M. run in with a large body of whales, at 10 A.M. lowered & caught one, some fog
639	Saturday July 3 rd Stowed down 10 casks of oil, 986 9 ships in sight	Commenced with pleasant weather from S. W. lying too with a whale alongside crew employed at stowing down oil, at 5 P.M. commenced cutting, finished at 9 A.M. strong breezes & fog, squalls S. E. at 9 A.M. commenced boiling, Lat. 4, 5, 55.50 Long. 4, 142.15
