Saturday July 5th These 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N. N. W. steering to the W. by the wind all sail set at Sunset shortened Sail Payall bearing S. by E. 18 miles Dis. saw several Sail one ship a Boiling middle & latter part variables winds and on different tacks.

Sunday July 6th these 24 hours begins with strong winds from the Westward steering on different tacks several sail in sight at Sunset Shortened sail Payall bearing W. S. W. 12 miles Dis at 11 Am. a Boat came from the shore and brought some refreshments. Strong Breezes ends the Day.

Monday July 7th Strong winds from the W. S. W. steering to the Northward by the wind under Double Reefed S. Sails at 5 P.M. spoke the Grand Duke of New Bedford and the Doctor of Portsmouth bearing S. W. 7 mi. Dis at 6 Am. made all sail and steered for Graciosa

Tuesday July 8th Begins with strong breezes from from the westward at 4 P.M. bying of 8 on of Graciosa in company with the Doctor of Portsmouth at 6 Do. shortened Sail standing on different tacks through the night at 6 Am. saw sperm Whales and lowered at 9 Do. the Boats returned on board & brought more at 10 Do. the Capt. lowered his Boat and went on shore.

Wednesday July 9th Commences with strong Breezes from the westward at 5 P.M. the Boat returned on board from the shore standing of and on through the night under short Sail at 8 Am. the Boat went on shore to get vegetation for the Ship

Thursday July 10th first part fine weather from the westward at 6 P.M. the returned in company with two Portuguese Boats loaded with potatoes & onions for the Ship at 8 P.M. bore away at 10 Do. Graciosa bore N. W. 10 mi. Dis. light winds through the night at 4 Am. St. George bore N. W. 12 mi. Dis. Remainder of these 24 hours one watch employed in storing away vegetation
