Monday July 14th Commences with strong breezes from the N. 4 Boats fast to the whales spoke the Tortois boats pursuing the whales at 5 P.M. got the whales to the Ship. at 4 Am. commenced cutting at 9 Do. finished all hands employed in clearing away the heads. wore ship to the southward winds from the Eastward

Tuesday July 15th Commences with moderate winds from the S. E. steering S. S. W. boiling at 11 Am. saw spouts wore ship to the eastward so ends Boiling

Wednesday July 16th all these 24 hours light winds and Calm headed to the southward at 8 Am. finished Boiling and washed of the Decks.

Thursday July 24th pleasant gales from the N. E. steering along the East side of St. Jagoes. at 6 P.M. got down abreast of the harbor there came of three boat loads of fruit. brought them all at 8 Do. bore away latter part strong winds from the Eastward steering South.

Friday July 25th Commences with light winds & variables attended with rain middle and latter part. fine weather and calm.

Saturday July 26th first part of these 24 hours Calm at 6 P.M. light breezes from the N. steering to the South all sail set so ends the Day.
