Tuesday Oct. 28th. Fine weather all these 24 hours with light winds from the N.E. and Calms.

Wednesday Oct. 29th. First part light winds from the N.E. Middle and latter part winds from the W. steering to the E.N.E. so ends these 24 h.

Lat. 34° 33' Long. 165° 35'

Thursday Oct. 30th. Commences with light winds from the W steering to the E.S.E. middle and latter part the same, so ends these 24 hours.

Lat. 34° 00' Long. 168° 14'

Friday Oct. 31st. Begins with light winds from the S.W. steering E.S.E. all sail set. Middle and latter part winds from the S.E.

Lat. 33° 23' Long. 170° 22'

Saturday Nov. 1st. Commences with light winds from the E.S.E. latter part winds from the E.N.E. at 7 AM. backed to the Southward 160° E.

Sunday Nov. 2nd. Light winds and Calms all these 24 hours saw blackfish and porpoises so ends.

Monday Nov. 3rd. First and middle part light winds from and calm latter part a fine breeze from the W. by N. steering to the E. by N. at 8 PM. spoke a Brit. Jackson whale ship and the Capt. came onboard employed in breaking out the main Hatchway so ends.

Lat. 33° 44' Saw N. Zealander, Long

Tuesday Nov. 4th. Commences with a fine breeze from the W by N steering to the E. by N. at 2 PM. Saw 3 sperm whales and lowered and struck one and lost the line at 5 Do. boats returned onboard and finished stowing of the main Hatchway at 8 AM. saw a dead at 10 Do. took her along side and commenced cutting so ends these 24 hours.

Wednesday Nov. 5th. Commences with strong winds from the south at 2 PM. finished cutting at 7 Do. commenced boiling so ends the day.

Thursday Nov. 6th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the S. W. bying to under short sail at 8 PM. finished boiling latter part employed in breaking out between Decks at 6 AM. saw braches.

Friday Nov. 7th. Commences with strong winds from the S.W. at 5 PM. finished stowing of between Decks at 6 AM. saw a sail so ends these 24 hours with a strong Breeze

Sunday Nov. 9th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the S.W. at 5 AM. made all sail and steered to the E. by N. so ends the Day.

Lat. 33° 56' Long. 174° 39'

Monday Nov. 10th. Commences with a fine breeze from the westward with all sail set steering E. by N. at sunset shortened sail and steered on our course at Day light made all sail so ends these 24 hours.

Lat. 33° 52' Long. 176° 43'

Tuesday Nov. 11th. Commences with a fine Breeze from the S.W. steering to the E. by N. all sail set at 4 PM. spoke a whale ship of Brit. Jackson 3 months out 400 Bbls. of oil the Capt. went onboard at 4 Do. the Boat returned onboard took in some sail at Day light made all sail so ends these 24 hours with light winds from the N. W.

Wednesday Nov. 12th. Commences with light winds from the Northward steering to the Eastward by the wind Middle and latter part the same employed in tarring the riggin so ends these 24 hours.

Thursday Nov. 13th. Commences with a strong Breeze from the Northward steering to the Eastward by the wind at Sunset have to latter part employed in breaking out the Fore Hatchway after water, so ends these 24 hours.

Friday Nov. 14th. First part strong winds from the North thick weather with some rain at 1 PM. set the Fore topsail Double reefed at 2 Do. saw Sperm whales and lowered at 4 Do. the boats returned to the ship and caught none the rest part of these 24 hours strong winds and rainy

Saturday Nov. 15th. Commences with strong winds from the E.N.E. with rain and thunder at 2 PM. saw Sperm Whales at half past 4 PM. lowered two boats the Waist boat struck the whale ran to the windward signal set from the ship to cut the line and come onboard at 6 Do. returned so ends these 24 hours with a strong Gale and rainy

Lat. 33° 24' Long.

Sunday Nov. 16th. All these 24 hours bying to under a close reefed main S. Sail with a heavy gale from the E. and rainy
