Tuesday Nov. 18th. Commences with a heavy gale from the N.E. by E. lying to under a close reefed M. S. Sail at 4 P.M. wore ship and headed to the S.E. Middle part more moderate at Daylight made some sail fine weather ends the day with all sail set heading S.E.

Lat. 33° 15' - - - - - Long. 179° 40' W.

Wednesday Nov. 19th. Commences with light winds from the S.W. and heavy swell running steering to the S.E. by the wind in company with an English Ship Middle and Latter part the same variously employed about the riggin so ends these 24 hours with fine weather.

Lat. 33° 24' - - - - - Long. 179° 02' W.

Thursday Nov. 20th. Commences with fine weather and light winds from the S.W. steering to the Eastward by the wind at 5 P.M. tacked ship at 6 Do. spoke the Barque General Burke of Sydney 6 weeks out, no oil the Capt. came on board so ends these 24 hours with all sail set, heading to the westward by the wind.

Lat. 33° 34' - - - - - Long. 179° 09' W.

Friday Nov. 21st. These 24 hours begins with fine weather from the S.W. steering to the W.S.W. by the wind in company with the General Burke at 4 P.M. the Capt. went on board at 7 Do. returned at 5 A.M. wore ship and headed to the northward with light winds from the W.S.W. and calm. so ends the Day.

Lat. 33° 40' - - - - - Long. 179° 40' W.

Saturday Nov. 22nd. All these 24 hours fine weather from the westward employed in tarring the riggin. so ends.

Lat. 32° 39' - - - - - Long. 179° 24' W.

Sunday Nov. 23rd. Fine weather all these 24 hours with light winds from the westward and calms in company with the Governor Bourke at 6 A.M. saw the Barque Rose of Wallifax at meridian the Capt. went on board the Governor Bourke so ends the Day.

Lat. 32° 11' - - - - - Long. 179° 31' W.

Monday Nov. 24th. First part light winds from the westward and calms at 6 P.M. spoke the barque Rose of Wallifax 14 months out 350 bbls. at 9 Do. the Capt. returned to the ship latter part a fine Breeze from the N. employed in caulking and varnishing the boards.

Lat. 32° 17' - - - - - Long. 179° 07' W.

Tuesday Nov. 25th. Fine weather and light winds from the N. at 3 P.M. saw sperm whales and lowered the waste boat fastened at 6 Do. took the whale along side at 6 Do. began to cut in at 8 finished at 11 Do. spoke the Ship Oscar of Fairhaven two years out 1200 bbls. so ends boiling.

Lat. 31° 51' - - - - - Long. 178° 57' W.

Wednesday Nov. 26th. Commences with a fine Breeze from the

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Eastward steering to the north at 3 P.M. made the French rock at 2 Do. finished boiling fine weather ends the day with a number of ships in sight.

Lat. 32° 00' - - - - - Long. 179° 21' W.

Thursday Nov. 27th. Commences with a fine breeze from the Eastward heading on different tacks Middle and Latter part the same at 11 Do. spoke the Harvest of Nantuxet. Capt. Pollard. 30 months out 2200 bbls.

Lat. 31° 39' - - - - - Long. 178° 53' W.

Friday Nov. 28th. Commences with a strong Breeze from the Southward Middle part the same so ends these 24 hours under Double reefed S. Sails heading on different tacks.

Lat. 31° 05' - - - - - Long. 177° 46' W.

Saturday Nov. 29th. Fine weather with light winds and variables Latter part employed in breaking out after water, a Barque in sight and the French rock bearing W. 4 S. 30 miles at meridian, so ends these 24 hours.

Lat. 31° 32' - - - - - Long. 177° 46' W.

Sunday Nov. 30th. First part light winds and variables Middle part same Latter part Calm saw a sail the rock bearing S.E. 25 miles Do.

Lat. 31° 05' - - - - - Long.

Monday Dec. 1st. Commences with light winds from the westward steering to the northward by the wind at 2 P.M. made Colly's Rocks, at 6 Do. made Colly's Island, saw a number of sail at 9 A.M. saw sperm whales at 10 Do. lowered and the lubber boat fastened at meridian took the whale to the ship.

Lat. Colly's rocks Bearing W.W. Long. 12 mi. Dis.

Tuesday Dec. 2nd at 1 P.M. Commenced cutting at 6 Do. finished so ends the day with light winds from the S.W. Boiling out the whale.

Lat. - - - - - Long.

Wednesday Dec. 3rd. Fine weather with moderate winds from the Southward at meridian Goat Island bore N.W. 1/4 W. and Colly's rocks bore S.W. 1/4 W. so ends the day boiling.

Wednesday Thursday Dec. 4th. Commences with moderate winds from the E. at 6 P.M. finished boiling at 11 Do. made Sunday Island bearing N. by E. so ends with strong winds under Double reefed S. Sails.

Thursday Friday Dec. 5th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the E. at 2 P.M. spoke the Brig Cornwallis of Sydney 5 months out. 500 barrels. so ends the Day Sunday Island bearing E. 12 mi. Distance.

Saturday Dec. 6th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the E. at 5 Do. Commenced breaking out the M. hatchway and stowing down oil.
