Monday Jan. 26th. at 5 AM. weighed anchor and got under way for Sea at 8 AM. got out the bay employed in stowing the anchors and clearing up Decks so ends stowing N. by the wind, winds from the E.N.E.

Tuesday Jan. 27th. Commences with a fresh breeze from the E.N.E. steering to the N. by the wind at sunset shortened sail and set Boats crew watches through the night at Daylight made all sail so ends, by the wind
Lat. 34° 11' - Long. 175° 02'

Wednesday Jan. 28th. All these 24 hours light winds variables and calms, at sunset shortened sail at Daylight made all sail at 9 AM. saw 2 sperm whales headed to the windward lowered 4 boats at 11 AM. the ship returned to the ship so ends 3 boats in pursuit of the whales
Lat. 33° 54' - Long.

Thursday Jan. 29th. at 1 PM. the waist Boat fastened to the whale at 2 Do. took her in tow; the ship out of sight to the leeward at 8 Do. took the whale to the ship at 5 AM. commenced cutting so ends the Day.
Lat. 33° 52' - Long.

Friday Jan. 30th. Commences with fresh gales from the S.E. at 1 PM. finished cutting at 4 PM. commenced boiling so ends these 24 hours boiling
Lat. - Long.

Saturday Jan. 31st. Commences with a strong breeze from the S.E. at Mid. night finished boiling at 9 AM. took in the Bow boat so ends these 24 hours heading to the northward with a strong gale from the Eastward & rainy.

Sunday Feb. 1st. Commences with a strong gale from the Eastward attended with rain latter part more moderate set the Fore & Mizzen Top-Sails so ends these 24 hours.
Lat. 33° 10' - Long. 174° 32'

Monday Feb. 2nd. First and Middle part strong winds from the Eastward latter part more moderate at 6 AM. commenced breaking out the M. Hatchway so ends these 24 hours stowing down oil
Lat. 32° 58' - Long.

Tuesday Feb. 3rd. All these 24 hours a fine breeze from the Eastward and a heavy swell running at 5 PM. finished stowing down the oil latter part employed in stowing off the Main Hatchway &c.
Lat. 32° 16' - Long. 176° 23' E.

Wednesday Feb. 4th. Commences with a strong breeze from the E. attended with rain at 2 PM. lying to under a close reefed main Topsail middle and latter part more moderate, winds from the N.E. by N.
Lat. 32° 23' - Long. 177° 6'

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Thursday Feb. 5th. All these 24 hours strong winds from N.E. by N. to E. by S. heading to the Eastward by the wind variously employed.
Lat. 33° 29' - Long. 177° 23'

Friday Feb. 6th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward heading on different tacks variously employed so ends
Lat. 34° 16' - Long. 177° 17' E.

Saturday Feb. 7th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward heading by the wind on different tacks latter part foggy, attended with small showers of rain
Lat. 33° 20' - Long. 177° 45'

Sunday Feb. 8th. First and Middle part strong winds from the eastward and thick weather attended with light showers of rain latter part moderate winds and fine weather, so ends these 24 hours.
Lat. 33° 32' - Long. 177° 49' E.

Monday Feb. 9th. Commences a fine breeze from the S.E. steering to the E. by S. at sunset took in some sail at 9 PM. spoke the Barque Prudens of Sidney 6 months out 800 bbls at 12 called all hands and hove the ship to under a close reefed M. Topsail, at 5 AM. took in the Bow Boat and turned up the waist Boat, so ends with a heavy gale from the southward.

Tuesday Feb. 10th. Commences with a heavy gale from the southward at 9 AM. rolled the waist boat under, and stove her badly, sheared a number of seas and carried away some of our bulwarks, latter part more moderate.
Lat. 33° 13' - Long.

Wednesday Feb. 11th. All these 24 hours strong Gale from the S. at 8 AM. took in the waist boat at 10 Do. set the Fore and Mizzen Topsails Doubled reefed, so ends employed in repairing the waist boat.
Lat. 32° 55' - Long. 179° 04' E.

Thursday Feb. 12th. First and middle part strong winds from the S. steering E. latter part more moderate, winds from the S.W. so ends these 24 hours.
Lat. 32° 58' - Long. 179° 29' W.

Friday 13th. Commences with a fine breeze from the S.W. steering to the N.E. Middle and latter part steering N. fine weather ends the Day.
Lat. 32° 02' - Long. 178° 12' E.

Saturday Feb. 14th. Commences with light winds from the S.W. steering to the North at sunset the General Rock bore N.W. by N. 15 miles Distance at 6 PM. spoke the barque ^{Prudens} of Hudson 31 months out 1000 bbls. of oil at 10 Do. unbent the M. P. Sail and bent another so ends with a strong breeze from the S.E. and a number of Sail in sight.
Lat. 31° 29' - Long. 178° 50' W.
