

Sunday March 29th. Commences with strong winds from the E. at 2 P.M. took in the Fore and Mizzen Top-Sails heading to the Southward by the wind Middle and Latter part strong winds attended with rain

5th meridian Coaa bearing N.W. 1/4 N. 30 mi. Dis.

Monday March 30th. More moderate at 1 P.M. set the Top-Sails double reefed, Fore-Sail and Spanker, at 4 Do. spoke the Baryue Huron, the Capt. come onboard, at Sunset took in sail middle part rainy latter part fine weather, so ends these 24 hours all sail set Coaa. bearing W. by N. 1/4 N. 35 miles Distance.

Tuesday March 31st. All these 24 hours fine weather with moderate winds from the Eastward at 4 past 6 Am. saw a sperm whale at 1 leeward in company with the Baryue Huron's boats at meridian returned to the ship without success So Ends.

Coaa. bearing W. N. W. 30 miles Distance.

Wednesday April 1st. First and Middle part fine weather with light winds from the N.E. Latter part strong winds from the N.W. by N. steering on different tacks so ends

Coaa. bearing W. by N. 30 miles Distance.

Thursday April 2nd. All these 24 hours strong winds from the N.W. steering to E.N.E. first part all sail set, middle and latter part squally and thunder attended with rain took in and made sail a number of times. so ends.

Friday April 3rd. Commences with strong winds from the N.W. steering to the E.N.E. all sail set at 4 P.M. had a heavy squall and split the fib took in the Top-Gallantsails and Main-Sail and close reefed the Top-sails at 5 Do. unbent the fib and bent another middle part the same latter part more moderate set the fib and Main-Sail so ends these 24 hours.

Saturday April 4th. Commences with strong winds from the N.W. steering to the E.N.E. under Double reefs, middle part the same, latter part steering to the N.E. with all sail set with winds from the W.S.W. attended with rain.

Saturday April 18th. First and middle part light winds from the Eastward and calms steering to the Northward by the wind, latter part light winds from the westward steering N.E. by E.
