

Monday April 20th Commences with light winds from the N.W. by N. steering to the Northward by the wind middle part the same latter part light winds from the Eastward and equally with some rain so ends  
 Lat 11.26 - - - - - Long 161.30 W.

Tuesday April 21st. Commences with winds from the N.W. steering to the N.E. by the wind Middle part calm, latter part light winds from the N. and equally  
 Lat 11.30 - - - - - Long 161.50 W.

Wednesday April 22nd. First part light winds and from the Eastward and Calms. Middle and latter part a fine breeze from N.W. steering on different tacks by the wind employed in making sunset so ends these 24 hours  
 Lat 10.43 - - - - - Long 161.27 W.

Thursday April 23rd. Commences with winds from the N.E. by N. steering to the N.W. by N. by the wind middle part equally latter part variable winds steering on different tacks so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday May 13th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the S.W. at 5 Am. the Capt. went onboard the Oscar at 9 Am. returned heading to the southward through the night by the wind under short sail, at Daylight made sail and steered to the N.W. so ends these 24 hours.
