Courses to the westward at 9 am. saw sperm whales and lowered in company with the Oscar at 11 Do. the waist boat fastened so ends these 24 hours -

Friday May 15th. at 4 P.M. took the whale to the ship, at 5 Do. commenced cutting at 6 Do. finished at 7 spoke the ship. Brances of New Bedford 12 mi. from Regu. - more 500 bbls. at 11 Do. began to boil, at 10 am. finished so ends these 24 hours
 Lat. 1° 54' N. Long 167° 24' W.

Saturday May 16th. These 24 hours winds from the Eastward steering to the northward by the wind at 4 P.M. Capt. Briggs, and Capt. Down's came on board at 8 Do. left the ship nothing more to be remarked so ends.
 Lat 1° 24' N. Long 167° 45' W.

Sunday May 17th. This Day winds from the Eastward steering on different tacks by the wind at 7 P.M. spoke the L. C. Richmond of Bristol 16 months out 850 bbls. nothing more to be remarked so ends these 24 hours in company with the Oscar.
 Lat 1° 36' N. Long 167° 55' W.

Monday May 18th. These 24 hours winds from the Eastward first and middle part steering by the wind on different tacks at 7 P.M. the Capt. went on board the L. C. Richmond in company with the Oscar, at 6 am. steered to the W. S. W. so ends.
 Lat 1° 57' N. Long 168° 25' W.

Tuesday May 19th. First part steering to the W. S. W. in company with the Oscar at sunset shortened and headed to the Northward with light winds from the Eastward at 9 am. steered to the N. S. W. at 9 Do. made all sail, strong winds the Day.
 Lat 2° 15' N. Long 168° 48' W.

Wednesday May 20th. First part strong winds from the Eastward steering to the N. S. W. under double reef at sunset spoke the Oscar and headed to the Northward by the wind at 6 am. made all sail and steered to the N. S. W. so ends.
 Lat 1° 5' N. Long 169° 30' W.

Thursday May 21st. Commences with a fine Breeze from the Eastward steering to the N. S. W. at sunset spoke the Oscar shortened sail and headed to the Northward by the wind at Daylight made all sail and steered to the N. S. W. so ends these 24 hours.
 Lat 1° 02' N. Long 169° 50' W.

Friday May 22nd. All these 24 hours fine weather and light winds from the East. - more steering different courses, employed in sail making so ends the Day.
 Lat 0° 12' N. Long 169° 21' W.

Saturday 23rd. First part steering to the N. S. W. at sunset shortened sail and headed to the Northward by the wind at Daylight made all sail and steered to the N. S. W. with winds from the E. S. E. so ends in company with the Oscar.
 Lat 0° 05' N. Long 169° 10' W.

Sunday 24th. First part steering to the N. S. W. at sunset shortened and headed to the southward, at Daylight made all sail and steered S. by E. so ends in company with the Oscar.
 Lat 0° 54' N. Long 169° 23' W.

Monday May 25th. At half past midnight lowered our boats in company with Oscar's boats, in pursuit of the whale but saw no more of him at 4 P.M. returned to the Ship, steering different courses these 24 hours with light from the Eastward.
 Lat 1° 22' N. Long 169° 50' W.

Tuesday May 26th. All these 24 hours fine weather with light winds from the Eastward steering on different courses with all sail set in company with the Oscar, variously employed.
 Lat 2° 01' N. Long 170° 24' W.

Wednesday May 27th. First part steering S. at sunset shortened sail standing on different tacks through the night, at Daylight made all sail and steered to the S. W. by E. in company with the Oscar, employed in sail making so ends these 24 hours.
 Lat 2° 50' N. Long 170° 56' W.

Thursday May 28th. First part steering to the S. W. by E. at 2 P.M. saw a sail to the land at 3 Do. saw sperm whales and lowered 4 boats in company with the Oscar the waist boat fastened and parted the line the labward boat fastened at 4 past Do. took the whale to the Ship and commenced cutting at 5 Do. finished, stood boats crews through the night standing on different tacks by the wind, at Daylight commenced boiling, at 9 am. made Endeavour's Island bearing S. S. E. 12 miles Distance at meridian the Island bearing S. S. E. 2 mi. Dis.
 Lat 3° 10' N. Long 171° 19' W.

Friday May 29th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the Northward by the wind at 4 P.M. finished boiling, at 7 Do. spoke the Samuel. C. Richmond, and more Ship to the Southward at 1 am. more Ship at 6 Do. made Mary's Island bearing N. S. W. 10 miles Dis. at 9 Do. the Capt. went on shore in company with Capt. Down's, and Capt. Shearman so ends the middle of the Island bearing S. S. E. 2 mi. Dis.
 Lat 2° 52' N. Long 171° 22' W.

Saturday May 30th. Commences with winds from the Eastward by and on the land at 4 P.M. the Capt. returned on board with a number of fish and shells in the boat, steered W. until sunset, lying all night under short sail on different tacks by the wind, at Daylight made all sail and steered W. by E. saw a number of finbacks so ends these 24 hours.
 Lat 2° 50' N. Long 172° 23' W.

Sunday May 31st. Commences with light winds from the Eastward, steering W. S. W. in company with the L. C. Richmond, and the Oscar, at 2 P.M. the Capt. went on board the L. C. Richmond at sunset shortened sail, at 8 Do. the Capt. came on board at Daylight made all sail and steered W. by E. so ends these 24 hours, employed in reading the Bible, cleaning shells, and splicing ropes.
 Lat 3° 10' N. Long 172° 52' W.

Monday June 1st. Commences with winds from the Eastward steering to the N. S. W. in company with the Oscar, and L. C. Richmond at 5 P.M. Capt. Down's, and Capt. Shearman, came on board, at 9 Do. the Captains went on board their own ships, standing on different tacks through the night under short sail at Daylight made all sail and steered to the northward by the wind saw a finback so ends these 24 hours variously employed.
 Lat 2° 35' N. Long 173° 29' W.

Tuesday June 2nd. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward, steering to the
