

Tuesday August 4th. All these 24 hours, a strong gale from E. to S.E. and thick weather, attended showers of rain, steering on Different tacks by the wind under short Sail, so ends the middle of Sackenuwa bearing S.E. 30 miles Distance.

Wednesday August 5th. Commences with a strong gale from the E. steering on Different tacks by the wind, under a close reefed Main and Mizzen Top-Sails, Fore Sail, and Spencers, middle part the same, latter part moderate at Day light set the Fore Top-Sail Double reefed Jib and Spanker, and let one reef out of the Main and Mizzen Top-Sails, so ends these 24 hours the middle of the Island bearing S.E. by S. 30 miles Distance.

Thursday August 6th. First and middle part light winds from the Eastward and thick weather, steering on Different tacks by the wind under short Sail Middle and latter part fine weather, with light winds from the westward and calms so ends all sail set, at Meridian the middle of Sackenuwa bearing S.E. 40 miles Distance.

Friday August 7th. Commences with light winds from the westward and fine weather, middle part squally with showers of rain, at 11 P.M. saw a whale, latter part strong winds from the Eastward steering on Different tacks by the wind so ends at Meridian the middle of the Island bearing S.E. 30 miles Distance.

Saturday August 8th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward, Middle and latter part steering on Different tacks by the wind, under Double reefed Fore and Main Top-Sails, and Spencers, so ends, Round Island bearing S.E. 10 miles Distance.

Sunday August 9th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double reefed Top-Sails spencers and Fore Top-Sail stayed, at Meridian the middle of Sackenuwa bearing S.E. 25 miles Distance.

Monday August 10th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward First and Middle part steering on Different tacks by the wind, at Daylight let one reef out of the Top-Sails and set the Fore-Sail and steered to the Westward at 10 P.M. set the Jib and Main Top-Sails so ends Round Island bearing S.E. by S. 6 miles Distance.

Tuesday August 11th. This Day strong strong winds from the Eastward, first part steering to the Westward with a reef upon our Fore-Sail, had 3 miles distance, at sunset shortened sail and headed to the northward, at Daylight made all sail and steered to the S.W. at meridian one of the Islands bearing S. 5 miles distance, took on the Top-Gallantsails and Belaying Jib.

Wednesday August 12th. First part strong winds from the Eastward steered to the S.W. by S, leaving a number of small Islands on our larboard hand at half past 5 P.M. saw Sperm Whales, at sunset took on Sail and headed to the

Northward, at Daylight made Sail and steered S. so ends with strong winds and squally with showers of rain, and a number of Islands in sight on our Larboard hand
Lat 17° 23' - Long 177° E.

Thursday August 13th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the South Westward, at sunset took on Sail, and headed to the Southward, middle part a strong Gale and squally attended with rain, at Daylight more moderate with winds from the Northward, made some Sail and steered to the S.E. fine weather ends the Day with all sail set, employed in Sail mending, land in sight
Lat 18° 02' S. - Long 176° 18' E.

Friday August 14th. Commences with light winds from the westward steering to the S.E. at sunset shortened Sail, middle part light winds and variable with rain at Daylight made all Sail and steered S. with winds from the S.E. bearing Round on our weather quarter, fine weather ends the Day, employed in Sail Mending
Lat 19° 49' S. - Long 177° 20' E.

Saturday August 15th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. steering to the Southward by the wind at 1 P.M. saw a Sperm Whale and lowered at sunset gave up the chase and returned to the Ship, and headed to the S.E. by the wind, at Daylight made all Sail and steered to the S.E. with winds from the Westward and thick weather, with showers of rain, at meridian Myrwoolly bearing bearing E. by N. 35 miles Distance.

Sunday August 16th. First part strong winds from the S.W. with heavy rain at 1 P.M. took on the Top-Gallantsails at 4 P.M. Double reefed the Top-Sails at sunset have to under short Sail, headed to the Westward at Daylight made all sail and steered to the S.E. with winds from the S.E. and fine weather at half past 6 P.M. saw large Sperm Whales, at 7 P.M. lowered at 9 P.M. the Waist Boat fastened and drove the Tonn, at 11 P.M. returned to the Ship, at meridian part of the Boats, in chase of the whales so ends these 24 hours,
Lat 18° 48' S. - Long 177° 26' E.

Monday August 17th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. and fine weather at 3 P.M. gave up the chase and returned to the Ship, at sunset shortened sail and headed to the S.E. with winds from the S.E. at Daylight made all sail so ends Myrwoolly bearing E. by N. 35 miles Distance employed in Sail mending
Lat 19° 15' S. - Long 177° 44' E.

Tuesday August 18th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, steering on Different tacks, and a number of different courses, Myrwoolly in sight, employed in Sail mending so ends the Day
Lat 18° 55' S. - Long 177° 35' E.

Wednesday August 19th. Commences with light winds and variables at sunset shortened Sail, middle part strong winds and rain, at Daylight made some Sail, latter part light winds from the S.E. and thick weather, so ends all sail set Myrwoolly bearing S.E. 20 miles Distance.
Lat 19° 01' S. - Long
