Sunday Oct. 11th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward at 6 Am. Saw Sperm Whales and lowered 4 Boats, and all fastened; the Onboard boat got on and the Waist Boat got two, the Boats Drove their crews, to end Boscanens Island bearing N.E. 20 miles Dis.

Monday Oct. 12th. at 2 P.M. got the whales to the Ship at 3 Do. commenced cutting at Sunset finished cutting two Whales, Employed in clearing away the heads through the night. at 7 Am. commenced cutting the whale, at 9 Do. finished and commenced boiling to end the Island bearing N.E. by N. 15 miles Distance.

Tuesday Oct. 13th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward steering on Different tacks by the wind, employe employed in boiling the Island bearing N.E.

Wednesday Oct. 14th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward steering to the W. all Sail set, at 6 Am. Saw Sperm Whales and lowered the Waist Boat faster but Linn the Sperm at 7 Do. the Boats returned to the Ship without success, to end

Thursday Oct. 15th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward, and calms steering to the westward, so ends the Day Proby's Island bearing E.S.E. 20 miles Dis.

Friday Oct. 16th. First part calm, Middle and latter part moderate winds from the E.S.E. steering to the W. the watch variously employe, so ends the Day Lat 15° 17' S. Long 176° 18' W.

Saturday Oct. 17th. All these 24 hours a fine Breeze from the E.S.E. steering to the W. by N. the watch variously employe about the riggin, so ends Lat 15° 18' S. Long

Sunday Oct. 18th. This Day winds from the E.S.E. first part steering to the W. by N. all Sail set, at Sunset took in some Sail, standing on Different tacks by the wind through the night, at Daylight made all Sail and steered to the S.W. by W. so ends, at Meridian Cairnell Island bearing S.E. W. 20 miles Distance Lat 15° 26' S. Chro. Long 179° 38' W.

Monday Oct. 19th. This Day a fine Breeze from the Eastward steering to the S.W. by E. at 2 P.M. made Pakenura, at Sunset here to under a Double reefed Main. Sail at Daylight made Sail and steered to the S.W. to end. Lat 16° 33' S. Pakenura bearing S.E.

Tuesday Oct. 20th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the Eastward steering on Different tacks by the wind under short Sail latter part employe in stowing down oil, so ends the Day Lat 15° 32' S.

Wednesday Oct. 21st. This Day strong winds from the Eastward steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double reefed Top-Sails, and Spencers, Middle and latter part attended with rain so ends Lat 15° 51' S.

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Thursday Oct. 22nd. All these 24 hours a Strong Gale from E. to S. by W. steering on Different tacks by the wind under short Sail middle and latter part attended with light showers of rain, squally weather ends the Day Lat 15° 47' S. the middle of the Island bearing S.E. E.

Friday Oct. 23rd. Commences with Strong winds from the S.E. W. and equally steering on Different tacks by the wind middle and latter part light winds from the S.E. and calms, so ends these 24 hours. Lat 15° 32' S. the middle of the Island bearing S.E. W.

Saturday Oct. 24th. This Day light variable winds and calms, the watch variously employe about the riggin, so ends the middle of the Island bearing S.E. Lat 16° 03'.

Sunday Oct. 25th. Commences with light winds and variables steering to the N.E. middle and latter part part a fine breeze from the S.E. by E steering to the S.E. so ends these 24 hours Lat 15° 11' S. Long 179° 56' W.

Monday Oct. 26th. This Day Strong winds from the S.E. steering to the S.E. by the wind at 6 Am. made Horn Island bearing N.E. by E. at meridian the Island bore N.E. by N. so ends employe in mending and painting Boats, &c. Lat 14° 40' S. Long 177° 54' W.

Tuesday Oct. 27th. Winds from the S.E. at 4 P.M. took Ship to the Southward at Sunset Shortened Sail, at Daylight made Sail and steered to the S.W. by the wind, latter part squally so ends these 24 hours. Lat 15° 02' S. Long 178° 54' W.

Wednesday Oct. 28th. Commences with winds from the S.E. steering to the S.W. by the wind at Sunset shortened Sail and wore Ship to the Eastward middle part rainy at 7 Am. made Sail and steered to the Southward by the wind so ends these 24 hours employe in Sail mending, making gaskets &c. Lat 15° 09' S. Long 179° 43' W.

Thursday Oct. 29th. Commences with strong winds from the S.E. at Sunset shortened Sail and wore Ship to the Eastward at 7 Am. made Sail and tacked to the southward, fine weather ends the Day the watch variously employe. Lat 15° 02' S. Long 179° 41' S.

Friday Oct. 30th. All these 24 hours light winds from the S.E. and fine weather steering to the Southward by the wind, at Meridian the middle of Pakenura bearing S.E. by E. Lat 15° 45' S.

Saturday Oct. 31st. All this Day light winds and variables steering on Different tacks and Different courses, at meridian the middle of the Island bearing S.E. 20 miles Distance so ends variously employe.

Sunday November 1st. at 1 P.M. Saw sperm whales at 2 Do. lowered the Onboard and lowered fastened the Onboard Boat got stove and parted the line at 2 Do. took
